# Proposition 1 Overview

- ▶ Sections 1-7
  - ▶ Reallocates Statewide Bond Costs from prior bonds to Prop 1
    - ▶ No change in amount of funding available for Prop 84 IRWM grants
  - ▶ Redirects unused funds from prior bonds to Prop 1
  - ▶ Repealed 2009 Water Bond
- ▶ Section 8
  - ▶ Chapter 12 Fiscal Provision
- ▶ Sections 9-13
  - ▶ Various legislative “clean up” items

# Chapter 7 Regional Water Reliability


- ▶ \$810M Regional Water Security
  - ▶ \$510M Integrated Regional Water Management
    - ▶ FY15-16 Proposed Budget = \$32.8M
    - ▶ Administered by DWR
  - ▶ **\$100M Water conservation & water use efficiency**
    - ▶ **FY 15-16 Proposed Budget = \$23.2M**
    - ▶ **Administered by DWR**
  - ▶ \$200M Multi-benefit stormwater management
    - ▶ FY 15-16 Proposed Budget = \$0.6M
    - ▶ Administered by SWRCB

# Chapter 7, Section 79746: Water Conservation & Water Use Efficiency

● \$100M

● \$23.2M in Governor's Budget for first  
year

- ▶ Urban water conservation plans, projects and programs to achieve water use targets
- ▶ Agricultural water managements plans or water use efficiency projects and programs



# Prop 1 Water Conservation Overview

- ▶ Urban Water conservation plans, projects and programs implemented to achieve urban water use targets
  - ✓ conservation programs and measures that are not locally cost effective.
  - ✓ programs targeted to enhance water-use efficiency for commercial, industrial, and institutional water users.
  - ✓ programs and measures targeted toward realizing the conservation benefits of implementation of the provisions of the state landscape model ordinance.
- ▶ Agricultural water management plans or agricultural water use efficiency projects and programs

# Water Conservation & Water Use Efficiency

## Proposed Program Approach\*

- Ag and Urban WUE implementation projects that result in State benefits:
  - ▶ Water savings
  - ▶ Increased in-stream flow
  - ▶ Improved water quality
  - ▶ Increased energy efficiency
- Ag and Urban WUE Technical Assistance, Planning, Feasibility Studies, Research and Development, Training, Education, Public Outreach, and Pilot projects.
- Primarily fund projects that are not locally cost effective

# WUE Grant Eligible Applicants

- ▶ Public Agencies (academia, local agencies & etc.)
- ▶ Nonprofit Organizations
  - ▶ 501.(c)(3) qualified to do business in California
- ▶ Federally recognized Indian Tribes
- ▶ State Indian Tribes listed on NAHC consultation list
- ▶ Public Utilities
- ▶ Mutual Water Companies
  
- ▶ Compliance with IRWM Program not required
- ▶ Projects funded not required to be in an adopted IRWM Plan or comply with that program
- ▶ Must comply with all Water Management Planning Acts
