The California Department of Water Resources (DWR) has made available for public review and comment the Draft Program Environmental Impact Report (DPEIR) for the Central Valley Flood Protection Plan (CVFPP). This DPEIR will inform DWR, which is developing the CVFPP, and the Central Valley Flood Protection Board, which will consider adoption of the CVFPP, about potential program-level environmental effects and mitigation measures from implementation of the CVFPP. Individual future projects will be implemented by project proponents such as DWR and other federal, State, or local agencies. Activities analyzed include improvement, remediation, repair, construction, reconstruction, and operation and maintenance of flood management facilities in the study area.

The proposed program primarily addresses areas receiving flood risk reduction benefits from facilities of the State Plan of Flood Control or from facilities and operation of the Sacramento–San Joaquin River Flood Management System; an area known as the Systemwide Planning Area. Potential effects on the Sacramento and San Joaquin valley and foothills and Southern California/coastal Central Valley Project/State Water Project service areas are also analyzed in the DPEIR. The program area includes Cortese-listed sites as identified in Government Code Schedule 65962.5.

The DPEIR found the following significant or potentially significant resource impacts that were reduced to a less-than significant level with the implementation of mitigation measures: aesthetics, groundwater resources, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology, noise, recreation, utilities and service systems, and water quality. Agricultural and forestry resources, biological resources – aquatic, biological resources – terrestrial, cultural resources, geology, soils and seismicity (including mineral and paleontological resources), land use and planning, and transportation and traffic may have impacts that could be significant and unavoidable or potentially significant and unavoidable.

The Draft Program Environmental Impact Report is available for public review and comment for 45 days. Written comments must be received at the physical or email address below no later than close of business (5 p.m. PST) Friday, April 20, 2012:
