Community Applications

- How management actions are compatible with community settings, and how they might best be applied to:
 - **Rural/Agricultural Areas** - Predominantly agriculturally-based areas with dispersed settlements outside towns and cities.
 - **Small Communities** - Developed areas outside urban and urbanizing areas in which there are fewer than 10,000 residents.
 - **Urban Areas** - Predominantly developed areas in which there are 10,000 residents or more and urbanizing areas planned or anticipated to have 10,000 residents or more within 10 years.

Workshop Process

- For each management action category:
 - Review and refine its compatibilities with the community setting.
 - Discuss conditions that support implementation to reduce flood risk including physical, geographical, and other conditions.
 - Review and refine implementation challenges
 - Discuss ways to overcome or alleviate implementation challenges.

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


