Looking at emerging techniques to measure Delta's changes

The day-long event will look at emerging techniques that can be used to quantify those effects. The seminar will be Monday, May 12 at UC Davis. Marketing workshop offers ways to promote Delta businesses

A [workshop](#) on promoting agritourism, recreation and other resources in the Delta will be held Tuesday, May 6, at the Tower Park Village Clubhouse west of Lodi. There will be information on developing a plan to cross-promote Delta businesses and expand exposure to new customers. The workshop is co-sponsored by the Delta Conservancy and the Delta Protection Commission.



Brown bag seminar will focus on the Delta's carbon emissions

The next [brown bag seminar](#) hosted by the Delta Science program will focus on whether varying Delta land uses can change carbon emissions. Dennis Baldocchi, from UC Berkeley, will be speaking Tuesday, April 29, in Sacramento. He will discuss the greenhouse gas fluxes that have been measured over managed and restored land in the Delta since 2007. This presentation will include a look at potential tradeoffs associated with land use change in the Delta.

UC Davis drought summit on tap for tomorrow

There will be discussions on the severity of the current drought, its impact on the economy, and potential state policies to deal with future droughts. There is no charge to attend the summit.
