Save the date - WEF flood management tour is May 14-15

The Water Education Foundation (WEF) will conduct a 2-day, 1-night tour that explores flood threat and flood management programs related to the South Delta and the lower San Joaquin River. Stops include Bear Creek, Paradise Cut, Jones Tract, Smith Canal, and San Joaquin River National Wildlife Refuge.
