DBW begins 2014 Egeria Densa Control Program in the Delta

The Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) has started its 2014 *Egeria Densa* Control Program. *Egeria Densa* is a fast growing, non-native submerged aquatic plant that has a significant impact on the shallow water habitat in the Delta ecosystem. In the Delta, 2,119 acres will be treated for *Egeria densa* June through September with Fluridone, an herbicide. More information is in this [news release](#).
