Conservancy requests comments on project environmental impacts

The Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Conservancy (Conservancy), as lead agency, is considering the approval and adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration on the environmental impacts of the Arundo Control and Restoration Project. The project is in Solano County, within the Dozier and Liberty islands U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangles, and includes multiple sites along the waterways in this region. The project will control approximately 15 acres of Arundo, an invasive plant species. The project will also restore native riparian restoration where Arundo has been removed or is near the control site. The public review and comment period ends July 20. CDFW offers grants for fish restoration projects

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) is now accepting grant applications for anadromous salmonid restoration projects that address the effects of the drought.
