



## Council report discusses recent changes to BDCP

The report discusses the recently announced changes to the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) that alter its relationship to the Council's Delta Plan and may prompt the Council to consider updating aspects of the Delta Plan.



## Two July seminars cover topics important for the Delta

The Delta Science Program, Ecosystem Restoration Program, and Surface Water Ambient Monitoring Program will present a seminar, July 7, in Sacramento,

titled Integrated Ecosystem Modeling for Adaptive Management — Lessons from the Great Lakes and Implications for the Bay-Delta System. Dr. John Wolfe of LimnoTech will describe the benefits of integrated modeling as part of an adaptive management approach that can be applied to the complexities and uncertainties facing the Bay-Delta system. Also, this program will present another seminar, July 15, in Sacramento, titled Sacramento Delta Levees — Radar-Based Monitoring from 41,000 feet. Dr. Cathleen Jones, Jet Propulsion Laboratory and California Institute of Technology, will present the status of the feasibility study that uses one of NASA's premier airborne science instruments, the UAVSAR synthetic aperture radar, to determine levee health status rapidly and on a broad scale.
