An independent scientific panel has completed its [review of the methodology proposed for development of the Delta Levee Investment Strategy \(DLIS\)](#). The



Delta Stewardship Council (Council) and DWR are considering the independent review responsive to their request to assess if the approach taken in the DLIS methodology is relevant, transparent, credible, and sufficiently sensitive to quantify and prioritize the assets and risks associated with the economic, environmental, and social attributes of all Delta islands and tracts. The review is a topic of the Council's August meeting.
