



CDFW is accepting proposals for Prop 1 Restoration Grants

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) is accepting proposals for restoration projects that further the objectives of the California Water Action Plan. \$31.4 million in Proposition 1 funds will be available for fiscal year 2015-2016 through CDFW's two Proposition 1 Restoration Grant Programs. The Delta Water Quality and Ecosystem Restoration Grant Program will fund up to \$7 million in projects that specifically benefit the Delta. Application deadline is September 16, 4 pm. SWRCB has Legal Delta water rights interactive map

The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) Delta Watermaster has an [interactive map of water rights associated within the Legal Delta](#). The legally defined Delta covers portions of Sacramento, Yolo, and San Joaquin counties in the Central Valley, and Solano and Contra Costa counties on the edge of the San Francisco Bay Area. This interactive map displays Appropriative Water Rights (permits and/or licenses) and Statements of Water Diversion and Use water rights for islands/areas in the Legal Delta. Completed Island Summaries of Water Rights are also on the map.
