



EPA proposes revised criteria for selenium for the San Francisco Bay and Delta

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is proposing to revise the current federal Clean Water Act selenium water quality criteria applicable to the salt and estuarine waters of San Francisco Bay and the Delta to ensure that the criteria are set at levels that protect aquatic life and aquatic-dependent wildlife, including federally listed threatened and endangered species. EPA will conduct one virtual public hearing August 22 and two in-person public hearings in San Francisco so that interested parties may provide oral comments on EPA's proposed rule.
