



DSC sends Legislature a progress report on the Delta Plan

The Delta Stewardship Council (DSC) has submitted a [report to the Legislature](#) updating the status on adopting the Delta Plan. The report says a final version of the plan has taken longer than expected because of complex issues involving the environmental impact report (EIR). The DSC says unless there is a need to recirculate the EIR, it is estimating the Delta Plan will be adopted this summer.

Delta foundation sets celebration date for raising of Dutra Tower

A [celebration](#) is set for Friday, June 1, for the raising of the historic Dutra Tower at the [Discover the Delta Foundation Educational Center](#). Built in 1904, the tower is 132 feet tall and includes two 55,000-gallon tanks. It was moved from Rio Vista across the Sacramento River and down Highway 12 to its new home. The tower will provide water for a hydropower display and a state-of-the-art irrigation system throughout the educational center.



FloodSAFE introduces e-update for flood management planning

FloodSAFE has rolled out an online newsletter focusing on flood management planning. The first edition of the [Statewide Flood Management Planning E-Update](#) includes details on developing a report outlining risks, recommendations and policies to meet California's flood risk management needs.

Mapping tool helps identify DACs in planning regions

A new [mapping tool](#) released by DWR can help identify disadvantaged communities (DACs) within an integrated regional water management planning region. The maps are based on data from the U.S. Census Bureau. For [Proposition 84 funding](#), DACs are defined as areas with a median household income less than 80 percent of the state average. The current threshold is \$48,706.



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
