Stops include Bear Creek, Paradise Cut, Jones Tract, Discovery Bay and Smith Canal. Recovery funds to be used on canal intertie project

The Department of the Interior has announced that the Bureau of Reclamation will provide \$20.7 million for the Delta-Mendota Canal/California Aqueduct Intertie project under the 2009 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act [You can find more informa-tion here.](#) The intertie is designed to connect the Delta-Mendota Canal and the California Aqueduct via a new pipeline and pumping plant to help improve Delta-Mendota Canal conveyance limitations, allow for maintenance and repair activities, and provide the flexibility to respond to Central Valley Project and State Water Project emergency water operations.

Flood Protection Board schedules meeting for Friday, April 23

The Central Valley Flood Protection Board has scheduled the next Board Meeting for Friday, April 23, in Sacramento.
