




## PPIC 'Water Myths' coincides with free seminar next Tuesday


## SF Estuary Partnership offers free Delta forum in Oakland Dec. 10

## Public scoping meetings set for North Bay intake project

DWR proposes to implement a North Bay Aqueduct Alternative Intake Project to improve water quality and reliability of State Water Project deliveries to the Solano County Water Agency and the Napa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District. It must prepare an environmental impact report and has scheduled three public meetings to discuss the scope and content of the EIR.
