



Governor, Obama administration outline revisions for BDCP

Gov. Edmund G. Brown Jr. and Interior Secretary Ken Salazar have announced revisions to the proposed Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP). They include construction of a conveyance to move water beneath the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta and other alternatives. All elements will undergo a public environmental review.
