



BDCP posts agenda for next week's meeting in Sacramento

The Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) has posted the [agenda](#) for next week's meeting in Sacramento. It will be Wednesday, Aug. 29, and will include an update on the joint agreement announced by the state and federal governments earlier this summer. Revised schedule released for Bay-Delta Plan workshops

The State Water Resources Control Board has released a [revised schedule](#) for three workshops that are part of the review of the [2006 Bay-Delta Plan](#). Information developed through the workshops will provide part of the basis for determining if the Bay-Delta Plan needs to be changed. The first workshop will be Wednesday, Sept. 5, in Sacramento. It will focus on ecosystem change and the low salinity zone.

The plenary meeting for [California Water Plan Update 2013](#) is less than three weeks away. The two-day session on Sept. 12 and 13, in Sacramento, will explore concepts that will be part of the Water Plan and other water initiatives. There will be updates on portions of the Water Plan focusing on groundwater, sustainability indicators and water technology. The second day will be highlighted by the keynote address from DWR Director Mark Cowin. More details are available in the [agenda](#). Flood board website adds section for delegated permits

The [Central Valley Flood Protection Board](#) has added a new element to its website; it is a segment called [Delegated Permits](#). It features a list of permits that can be approved by the executive officer without bringing them before the board. Certain criteria must be met in order to qualify as a delegated permit. Those meeting the criteria are listed in a [spreadsheet](#) that is updated on the first Friday of every month.



Water managers asked to complete climate change survey

The [Water Utility Climate Alliance](#) (WUCA) has set up an [online survey](#) to learn how water utility managers are making plans to deal with climate change. WUCA is hoping to identify several water utilities interested in becoming potential case studies. The survey will be available through the end of August.
