## Underwater test to keep fish from entering Delta slough

An underwater system of speakers, bubbles and light is being tested at the entrance to the Delta's Georgiana Slough. The non-physical barrier is intended to keep juvenile salmon and steelhead out of the slough where their chances of survival decline. Hundreds of fish are being tagged and monitored to see if the barrier steers them away from the slough and keeps them in the Sacramento River. A new version of the [Creek Watch](#) iPhone application is available to help monitor watershed conditions. The app uses submitted photographs to monitor water levels, flow rates and pollution in creeks and rivers. The data are shared with groups and agencies to help track pollution and manage water resources.
