## Spawning Gravel Augmentation Project Phase 6 has begun

The Bureau of Reclamation, in partnership with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Water Forum, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and Sacramento County Regional Parks, has begun Phase 6 of the Lower American River Salmonid Spawning Gravel Augmentation Project. The project adds approximately 6,000 tons of gravel and creates approximately 5,500 square yards of improved spawning habitat and 400 yards of improved side channel juvenile rearing habitat. ## USBR awards contract for fish facility improvements

The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) has awarded a contract to Valentine Corp. of San Rafael to replace and improve a major louver system at the Tracy Fish Collection Facility in Byron.
