



DSC reviewing comments on final draft of the Delta Plan

The comment period for the [final draft of the Delta Plan](#) has closed, and the Delta Stewardship Council (DSC) is reviewing those comments and making any necessary revisions to the plan. The draft programmatic environmental impact report and the proposed rulemaking package are undergoing similar reviews. The final Delta Plan is expected to be published this spring.

Proposed BDCP conveyance proposal may add 136,000 jobs

The California Natural Resources Agency has released a [report on the number of jobs](#) that would be created by the Bay Delta Conservation Plan's (BDCP's) proposed water conveyance system and habitat restoration measures. The proposal calls for tunnels that would deliver water to customers of the [State Water Project](#) and the [Central Valley Project](#). The study found that more than 136,000 jobs would be created over the 50-year life of the BDCP.

Human rights water bill discussion included in executive briefing

The Water Education Foundation's annual [executive briefing](#) will include segments focusing on the Delta and the BDCP. It will be March 14 and 15, in Sacramento. There will also be information on the implementation of the recently enacted [AB 685](#), the Human Right to Water Bill. It establishes a state policy that every Californian has a right to clean, affordable and accessible water.

Flood board and water commission set for March meetings

A briefing on the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Levee Safety Program is on the [March 8 agenda](#) for the Central Valley Flood Protection Board. There will also be a presentation on the feasibility of moving future board meetings to Sacramento City Hall, where improved Wi-Fi and webcasting would be available.
