



Draft BDCP EIR/EIS is now posted online

The 20,000-page consultant draft [Environmental Impact Report and Environmental Impact Statement \(EIR/EIS\)](#) posted on May 10 describes the potential effects of the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) and alternative ways to address water supply reliability and ecosystem restoration in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

DWR requests public input on proposed project

DWR is proposing to fund a project titled Grasslands Mitigation Preserve: Advance Mitigation for Giant Garter Snake as a direct expenditure under the Central Valley Flood Protection Plan (CVFPP) and Conservation Framework and Strategy Guidelines. As required by Proposition 1E, this project will ultimately provide advance mitigation for improvements to the State Plan of Flood Control Facilities.
