

Real Time Snow Water Equivalent (SWE) Simulation May 29, 2012 Sierra Nevada Mountains, California

Introduction

This report is a beta product and subject to revision. We are developing a real-time SWE estimation scheme based on historical SWE reconstructions between 2000-2009, a near real time MODIS image, and daily in situ SWE measurements for the Sierra Nevada in California (Molotch, 2009; Molotch and Margulies, 2008; Molotch and Bales, 2006; Molotch and Bales, 2005, Molotch, et. al., 2004 and Guan). Real-time SWE will be released on a weekly basis during the maximum snow accumulation/ablation period.




Figure 1. SWE amounts for May 29, 2012 are shown on the left and SWE amounts for May 22, 2012 are shown on the right. SWE snow sensors are shown in red and yellow, red sensors recorded snow and yellow sensors recorded no snow on the map date.

Discussion




Figure 2. Percent of average SWE for May 29, 2012 for the entire Sierra (on left) and by watershed (on right). Watershed percentages are calculated for all model pixels above 3000'. SWE snow sensors have been added to the map on the left, the 3 red sensors are those that recorded snow on May 29th, the yellow sensors are those that recorded no snow on May 29th.




Figure 3. 10 year modeled average SWE for May 29th on the left with snow sensors shown in purple that recorded no snow on May 29, 2012 and in red for sensors that recorded snow on May 29, 2012; and a banded elevation map on the right.

The most recent cloud-free MODIS/MODSCAG image available is for May 29, 2012. Figure 1 shows SWE amounts for May 29, 2012 on the left and SWE amounts for May 22, 2012 on the right. On May 29, 2012 only 3 snow sensors in the Sierra network were recording snow out of a total of 99 sensors. In 2007, a very dry year, 3 sensors recorded snow on May 29th, and in 2009, a normal year, 20 sensors recorded snow on May 29th. Note the locations of sensors that aren't recording snow (shown in yellow in Figure 1) are lower elevation than the remaining snowpack, so calculations from sensors alone do not accurately calculate SWE for each watershed. Figure 2 shows the percent of average SWE for May 29, 2012 for the snow-covered area on left and on the right is the mean percent of average for May 29, 2012 shown by watershed for all model pixels above 3000' (shown as black elevation contour line). Figure 3 shows the 10 year modeled average SWE for May 29th on the left with snow sensors shown in purple that recorded no snow on May 29, 2012 and in red for sensors that recorded snow on May 29, 2012, and a banded elevation map on the right. Table 1 shows mean SWE and % of Average SWE for 5/29/2012, mean SWE for 5/29/2012, change in SWE between 5/22/2012 and 5/29/2012 summarized for each watershed above 3000'. Table 2 shows the average SWE by elevation band inside each watershed for 5/29/2012, 5/22/2012, the percent of average for 5/29/2012 and the change in SWE between 5/22/2012 and 5/29/2012.

Methods

Results for the date of May 29, 2012 are based on May 29, 2012 real-time data from 3 in situ SWE measurements distributed across the Sierra Nevada, one Moderate Resolution Imaging Spectroradiometer (MODIS)/Terra Snow cover daily cloud-free image which has been processed using the MODSCAG fractional snow cover program (Painter, et. al. 2009), a normalized reconstructed SWE image for March 1, 2006, and an anomaly map based on 10 years of modeled SWE (2000-2009). This year the near real time SWE product is an iterative process, we are refining the processing as we get better data and develop better methodology. Relative to snow stations and the NWS SNODAS product, the reconstructed SWE product correlates strongly with full natural flow, especially late in the snowmelt season (Guan, et. al.).
