

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NOTICE OF RECLAMATION DISTRICT 1004'S INTENT TO SERVE AS GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY FOR A PORTION OF THE WEST BUTTE SUBBASIN

This letter constitutes notice to the Department of Water Resources (DWR), pursuant to Water Code sections 10723(d) and 10723.8, of Reclamation District 1004's (District) intent to undertake sustainable groundwater management of the West Butte Subbasin (the Basin) as a Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA) pursuant to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA). This notice of intent is timely filed within 30 days of the date the District's Board of Trustees (Board) approved a resolution electing to serve as a GSA. The resolution is attached hereto as Exhibit A and a map showing the District's service area boundaries and proposed GSA management area is attached as Exhibit B to the resolution. No new bylaws, ordinances, or other new authorities were adopted in connection with this resolution to serve as GSA.

As of the date of this notice, the counties of Glenn and Colusa have also given notice of their intent to serve as GSAs for the Basin.¹ It does not appear that any other entities would be eligible to serve as GSAs within the District's proposed management area. Should it elect to serve as GSA, the GSA management area of Western Canal Water District may be near or adjacent to the District's proposed GSA management area. Other potential GSAs in the Basin, but outside of the District's proposed GSA management area, include Butte County, Durham Irrigation District, and the City of Chico.

Interested parties within the District's proposed GSA management area, determined pursuant to Water Code section 10723.2, include:

(a) Holders of overlying groundwater rights, including:

(1) Agricultural users

The District's proposed GSA management area is composed almost entirely of agricultural users, most of whom have a preexisting relationship with the District.

(2) Domestic well owners

There are domestic wells within the GSA, however, based on current and likely future groundwater conditions in the Basin, it is anticipated that the GSP will exclude domestic wells.

(b) Municipal well operators

N/A. None within the District's proposed GSA management area.

(c) Public water systems

N/A. None within the District's proposed GSA management area.

(d) Local land use planning agencies

Colusa County
Glenn County

(e) Environmental users of groundwater

There are environmental users of groundwater within and near the District's proposed GSA management area. These environmental users pump groundwater to provide habitat to migrating waterfowl and other species.

¹ The Butte County Board of Supervisors passed Resolution No. 15-039 on March 24, 2015, electing to be GSA for groundwater basins within Butte County, including the portion of the Basin within Butte County, but no notice of intent has been posted on DWR's website, nor was notice provided to the District. No portion of the District's proposed GSA management area is within Butte County.

(f) Surface water users, if there is a hydrologic connection between surface and groundwater bodies

N/A.

(g) The federal government, including, but not limited to, the military and managers of federal lands

N/A. None within the District's proposed GSA management area.

(h) California Native American tribes

N/A. None within the District's proposed GSA management area.

(i) Disadvantaged communities, including, but not limited to, those served by private domestic wells or small community water systems

N/A. None within the District's proposed GSA management area.

(j) Entities listed in Section 10927 that are monitoring and reporting groundwater elevations in all or a part of a groundwater basin managed by the groundwater sustainability agency

Such entities, if any exist, are included above.

Under Water Code section 10723.8(a)(4), this notice must explain how the interests of the interested parties identified above will be considered in the development and operation of the GSA and the development and implementation of the GSP. The District is committed to an open and inclusive process to implement SGMA. Interested parties will have opportunities, both formal and informal, to provide input to the District throughout the process of developing, operating, and implementing the GSA and GSP. Such opportunities may include, but are not limited to, public comment periods required by SGMA (e.g., Water Code section 10728.4); opportunities for public comment during the District's regular and special board meetings; and at other times to be determined and noticed pursuant to Water Code section 10727.8(a).

RESOLUTION NO. 2015-4
ELECTION TO SERVE AS GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY

WHEREAS, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014 (“SGMA”) was signed into law on September 16, 2014; and

WHEREAS, SGMA requires that each California groundwater basin or sub-basin be managed by a Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA), or multiple GSAs, and that such management be implemented pursuant to an approved Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) or multiple GSPs; and

WHEREAS, the District overlies a sub-basin of the Sacramento Valley Groundwater Basin known as the West Butte Sub-basin (Basin No. 5-21.58 in the Department of Water Resources’ CASGEM system), an unadjudicated groundwater basin overlying portions of Butte, Glenn, and Colusa Counties (the “Basin”); and

WHEREAS, the District, as a local agency overlying the Basin, is authorized to be a GSA for the Basin; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing to consider whether the District should elect to be a GSA for the Basin, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, was published in the Colusa Sun Herald, the Glenn County Transcript and the Chico Enterprise Record, on 7/1/15 and again on 7/8/2015, pursuant to section 6066 of the Government Code, as required by section 10723(b) of the Water Code; and

WHEREAS, courtesy copies of the hearing notice were also sent to each of the Basin’s other potential GSAs, including the Boards of Supervisors of Glenn, Colusa, and Butte Counties, the City of Chico, Western Canal Water District, and Durham Irrigation District; and

WHEREAS, the District held a public hearing at which its Board of Trustees considered whether the District should become a GSA for the Basin; and


WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the District to become a GSA for the Basin;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, ORDERED, AND DIRECTED that:

1. The District hereby elects to be the exclusive Groundwater Sustainability Agency for at least that portion of the West Butte Sub-basin that is shown the map attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference.


2. Within 30 days of the date of this Resolution, the District Manager is directed to submit a notice of the District's intent to the Department of Water Resources, pursuant to Water Code section 10723.8(a).
3. The District Manager shall, after complying with Water Code section 10727.8, begin the process of developing the District's Groundwater Sustainability Plan for the Basin in accordance with all applicable statutes and regulations.
4. The District Manager shall create and maintain a list of persons interested in receiving notices concerning the District's SGMA process pursuant to section 10723.4 of the Water Code.
5. The District Manager shall provide regular progress reports on the SGMA implementation process to the Board at least quarterly.
6. The District Manager shall evaluate the feasibility and potential benefits of pursuing a modification to the boundaries of the Basin.
7. The Board of Trustees shall create a Board committee to oversee implementation



Map Features


-  RD 1004 Service Area

Resolution No. 2016-5

WHEREAS, Reclamation District 1004 (District), pursuant to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act, has elected to serve as a Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA) for a portion of the West Butte Subbasin (Basin) of the Sacramento Valley Groundwater Basin within Glenn County and Colusa County, and on August 8, 2015, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) posted notice thereof on its website; and

WHEREAS, the District's initially proposed GSA management area for the Basin is depicted in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, on July 2, 2015, DWR posted notice that Colusa County had elected to serve as GSA for all portions of the Basin that are within Colusa County; and

WHEREAS, on July 9, 2015, DWR posted notice that Glenn County had elected to serve as GSA for all portions of the Basin that are within Glenn County; and

WHEREAS, the District's notice of intent to serve as GSA was timely filed pursuant to Water Code § 10723.8(c) sooner than 90 days after DWR posted the notices of intent of Glenn County and Colusa County; and

WHEREAS, on January 1, 2016, legislation known as Senate Bill 13 (2015) took effect which, among other things, mandated in Water Code § 10723.8(c) that if the proposed GSA management areas of two or more entities that had submitted notices of intent to become GSAs overlapped, then none of the entities would be recognized as GSAs until the overlap was resolved and eliminated; and

WHEREAS, the proposed GSA management area of the District overlaps with portions of Glenn County's and Colusa County's proposed GSA management areas; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Water Code § 10723.8(c), entities whose proposed GSA management areas overlap may modify their proposed management areas in order to eliminate overlaps, and

such modification does not require a new notice of intent unless the modification would effect a “material change” to the previously submitted notice of intent; and

WHEREAS, the modification proposed herein would partly resolve the overlaps with Glenn County and Colusa County, and this proposed modification does not involve a material change requiring a new notice of intent because the modification to the District’s proposed West Butte GSA management area would not require any change to the District’s previously submitted notice of intent for the Basin aside from the boundaries of the District’s proposed GSA management area, and more specifically, there would be no change in the information provided in the District’s notice of intent related to the list of interested parties developed pursuant to Water Code § 10723.2; and


WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the District to modify its proposed West Butte GSA management area as indicated herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, ORDERED, and DIRECTED:

1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.
2. Reclamation District 1004 hereby modifies its proposed GSA management area as shown in the map attached hereto as Exhibit B, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
3. The District Manager is authorized to take all action necessary to effectuate the modification of the District’s proposed GSA management area as described herein, including submitting this resolution, the exhibits, and the GIS shape files to DWR pursuant to Water Code § 10723.8(c).
