Subject: Notice of Election to Become a Groundwater Sustainability Agency

Dear Mr. Nordberg:

Pursuant to California Water Code section 10723.8 of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA), the City of Williams (City) provides this Notice of its election to serve as a Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA) for a portion of the Colusa Groundwater Subbasin (Number 5-021-52) (Basin) as defined in the Department of Water Resources' Bulletin 118. The Basin is unadjudicated and has been designated as medium-priority by the Department of Water Resources (DWR). This Notice includes all applicable information listed in Water Code section 10723.8.

The City of Williams is a general law city organized under the laws of the State of California. The City is located at the crossroads of Interstate 5 and State Route 20 in Colusa County and overlies the Colusa Groundwater Subbasin. The City has exclusive drinking water supply, water quality and water production responsibilities within and for the City, and has land use authority and groundwater management powers under its general police powers and other applicable law. SGMA provides that a local agency overlying a groundwater basin may decide to become a GSA for that basin. The City of Williams is a "local agency" as defined in SGMA. (Water Code § 10721(n) ["local agency" means a local public agency that has water supply, water management, or land use responsibilities within a groundwater basin"].)

On March 16, 2016, pursuant to Section 10723 of the California Water Code, the City Council of the City of Williams approved Resolution 16-05 declaring the City's election to form the Williams Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("Williams GSA") for the portion of the Colusa Groundwater Basin underlying the City's jurisdictional boundaries. Resolution 16-05 is attached to this Notice as Exhibit A.

The City Council approved Resolution 16-05 during a public hearing after publication of notice provided pursuant to California Government Code section 6066 and Water Code section 10723. In particular, the City noticed the March 16, 2016, hearing by publication in Colusa Sun Herald. A copy of the publication notice is attached as Exhibit B to this Notice. No written or public comments were submitted during the hearing. No new bylaws, ordinances or new authorities were developed by the City of Williams at the time the Resolution 16-05 was adopted.

The purpose of the Williams GSA is to undertake sustainable groundwater management, pursuant to SGMA's requirements, for that portion of the Colusa Groundwater Subbasin underlying the City of Williams' jurisdictional boundaries and sphere of influence. The portion of the basin to be managed is coterminous with the City of Williams' Sphere of Influence, as depicted in Exhibit C to this Notice.

The City of Williams is aware that as of the date of this Notice, other agencies have provided notice to DWR that they intend to form GSAs within various portions of the Basin in Colusa County. To the best knowledge of the City, the following entities have filed such notices within Colusa County: Reclamation District No. 108, Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District, the County of Colusa, Colusa County Water District, and Provident Irrigation District and Princeton-Codora-Glenn Irrigation district. Additionally, a number of agencies have filed notices to manage portions of the Basin in other counties. The City has been working with and intends to work in cooperation with other entities within the Basin to comply with SGMA to sustainably manage the resources in the Basin.

The City of Williams has prepared an initial list of interested parties that will be used and expanded in the future to ensure that the interests of all beneficial uses and users of groundwater, as well as those responsible for implementing a Groundwater Sustainability Plan, will be considered as required by Section 10723.2 of the Water Code. This initial list is contained in Exhibit D to this Notice.

## **RESOLUTION 16-05**

### **RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO ESTABLISH THE CITY OF WILLIAMS AS THE GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY FOR ITS PORTION OF THE COLUSA GROUNDWATER BASIN COTERMINOUS WITH THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF WILLIAMS AND WHICH SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE WILLIAMS GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY.**

**WHEREAS**, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014 went into effect on January 1, 2015, and

**WHEREAS**, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014 enables the State Water Resources Control Board to intervene in groundwater basins unless a local public agency or combination of local public agencies for a Groundwater Sustainability Agency or agencies (GSA) by June 30, 2017 (California Water Code section 10735), and

**WHEREAS**, retaining local jurisdiction over the water management and land use is essential to sustainably manage groundwater as a critical public health resource and to the vitality of the City of Williams' economy, community and environment, and

**WHEREAS**, any local public agency that has water supply, water management or land use responsibilities within a sub-basin may elect to be a Groundwater Sustainability Agency (California Water Code sections 10721 and 10723), and,

**WHEREAS**, the City of Williams is the local agency with exclusive drinking water supply, water quality and water production responsibilities within and for the City of Williams, and

**WHEREAS**, the exclusive source of this water supply is groundwater from the Colusa Groundwater Basin; and

**WHEREAS**, California Water Code Section 10723(a) authorizes any local agency overlying a groundwater basin to establish itself as a Groundwater Sustainability Agency for that basin or portions thereof, and

**WHEREAS**, California Water Code Section 10721(j) defines a Groundwater Sustainability Agency as one or more local agencies that implement the provisions of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act, and,

**WHEREAS**, the proposed boundaries of the Colusa Groundwater Basin that the City intends to manage as a Groundwater Sustainability Agency are set forth in Attachment A and are described as the City Limits of the City of Williams, and

**WHEREAS**, establishing the City of Williams as a Groundwater Sustainability Agency will enable the City of Williams to prepare and implement a Groundwater Sustainability Plan for the Colusa Groundwater Basin coterminous with and underlying the City of Williams City Limits, together with other Colusa Groundwater Basin Groundwater Sustainability Agencies, and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Williams is committed to sustainable management of its groundwater resources, and

**WHEREAS**, adoption of this Resolution does not constitute a “project” under California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines Section 15378(b)(5) including organizational and administrative activities of government because there would be no direct or indirect physical change in the environment, and,

**WHEREAS**, the City held a public hearing on this date after publications of notice pursuant to California Government Code section 6066 to consider adoption of this Resolution.


**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:**

1. That the City Council of the City of Williams hereby declares and elects that it be and is established as the Groundwater Sustainability Agency for the portion of Colusa County that overlies the Colusa Groundwater Basin Groundwater coterminous with the City of Williams City Limits, with the powers and the duties set forth at California Water Code sections 10725 et seq.,
2. That this Groundwater Sustainability agency shall be known as the Williams Groundwater Sustainability Agency and will use its existing legislative body for governance purposes.
3. That the City Clerk shall submit a notice of this Resolution to the State Water Resources Control Board.
4. That the Williams Groundwater Sustainability Agency shall consider the interests of all beneficial uses and users of groundwater, as well as those responsible for implementing groundwater sustainability plans and will develop an outreach program for all stakeholders.
5. That the Williams Groundwater Sustainability Agency shall establish and maintain a list of persons interested in receiving notices regarding plan preparation, meeting announcements, and availability of draft plans, maps, and other relevant documents. Any person may request, in writing to be placed on the list of interested persons.
6. That such notification of interested persons shall include an explanation of how their interests will be considered in the development and operation of a Groundwater Sustainability Plan.







Map of Williams City Limits and Colusa Subbasin.








The Williams GSA will communicate and coordinate with these entities when undertaking SGMA activities.
