

San Luis Obispo County Proposition 1E Proposal AB 1420 and Water Meter Compliance Information

Attachment 12 consists of AB 1420 and water meter compliance documentation from the San Luis Obispo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (County). The County is a wholesaler of water via Flood Control Zone 3's (Zone 3) Lopez Water Treatment and Distribution Facilities that qualifies as an Urban Water Supplier under AB 1420 and California Water Code Section 525 *et seq.*

The County submitted a Proposition 84 Integrated Regional Water Management Implementation Grant Application in January 2010. As part of that grant application, both the AB 1420 and Water Meter Compliance self-certification documents were submitted by the County to the Department of Water Resources (DWR). The forms are consistent with the answers given in Questions 10 through 12 of the electronic application.
