

ATTACHMENT 1. AUTHORIZATION AND ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

✓ **Adopted IRWM Plan and Proof of Formal Adoption**

The East Stanislaus Regional Water Management Group (RWMG), formally known as the East Stanislaus Regional Water Management Partnership (ESRWMP), is comprised of the Cities of Modesto, Turlock, Ceres, and Hughson. These member agencies adopted the East Stanislaus IRWMP in 2014. The City of Modesto adopted the Plan on January 28th, the City of Ceres adopted it on January 27th, the City of Hughson adopted it on January 13th and the City of Turlock adopted it on February 11th. The ESRWMP mailed the adopted East Stanislaus IRWMP to DWR for the Plan Review Process on March 24, 2014 and received DWR's findings that the ESIRWMP is consistent with the Guidelines on June 3, 2014. DWR's final review was sent to the ESRWMP on July 2nd, documenting the ESIRWMP's consistency with the IRWM Planning Act and related IRWM Plan Standards. Proof of formal adoption is provided in Appendix 1.4.

This application contains one inter-regional project, the North Valley Regional Recycled Water Program (NVRWWP). This project falls within both the East Stanislaus IRWM Region and the Westside-San Joaquin IRWM Region.

The Westside-San Joaquin IRWM Region prepared its Integrated Water Resources Plan (WIWRP) in 2006 and updated it to meet 2012 IRWM Program Guideline Plan Standards and the 2014 IRWM Drought Solicitation IRWM Guidelines in 2014. The updated IRWMP, entitled the *Westside Integrated Water Resources Plan* (WIWRP) was submitted to DWR for review on July 17, 2014. The San Luis and Delta-Mendota Water Authority, the Westside-San Joaquin Regional Water Management Group, will adopt the WIWRP on September 4, 2014. The Westside-San Joaquin Region project proponent, the Del Puerto Water District, will adopt the WIWRP on August 20, 2014. Proof of adoption will be provided to DWR by September 9, 2014.

WHEREAS, on June 22, 2010, by Resolution 2010-276 the City Council approved Cost Sharing Agreement between the Cities of Ceres, Hughson, Modesto, and Turlock for development of an IRWMP, and

WHEREAS, on June 22, 2010, by Resolution No. 2010-277 the City Council approved an agreement with RMC Water and Environment for consultant services to develop and Integrated Regional Water Management Plan, and

WHEREAS, on August 9, 2011, by Resolution 2011-359, the City Council approved the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Modesto and the Cities of Ceres, Hughson, and Turlock related to development of the East Stanislaus Integrated Regional Water Management Partnership, and

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2011, the cities of Modesto, Ceres, Hughson, and Turlock signed the Memorandum of Understanding to create the East Stanislaus Regional Water Management Partnership, the Regional Water Management Group for the Region, and

WHEREAS, on September 1, 2011, the Department of Water Resources completed their process review of the East Stanislaus Regional Acceptance Application and announced acceptance of East Stanislaus as an Integrated Regional Water Management Region, and

WHEREAS, the Partnership prepared the East Stanislaus IRWMP from 2010 through 2013 based on the California Department of Water Resources Proposition 84 & 1E Integrated Regional Water Management Plan Guidelines, and

WHEREAS, the benefits of integrated regional water management planning are intended to increase efficiencies and effectiveness of water resources planning, enhance collaboration across agencies and stakeholders, and improve responsiveness to regional needs and priorities, and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the East Stanislaus IRWMP is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant (CEQA) to CEQA Guidelines §15262 and §15306 because the Plan involves planning studies for possible actions that participating agencies have not yet approved and consists of basic data collection that would not result in the disturbance of any environmental resource,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto that it hereby adopts the East Stanislaus Integrated Regional Water Management Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that staff is hereby authorized to submit the IRWMP to the Department of Water Resources for acceptance.




