

1I. Groundwater Management Compliance

There are three (3) groundwater users that will receive funding from this proposed grant: The City of Signal Hill, the City of Cerritos, and the City of Huntington Park. Since these users are located in an adjudicated groundwater basin, they are not required to have an adopted groundwater management plan (GWMP). The Water Replenishment District of Southern California (WRD or District) is the groundwater manager for the Central and West Coast Groundwater Basins located in southern Los Angeles County. Both the West Coast and Central Basins are adjudicated, and, therefore, are not required under AB3030 guidelines to have a GWMP as stated in Water Code Section 10753 (a):

“10753. (a) Any local agency, whose service area includes a groundwater basin, or a portion of a groundwater basin, that is not subject to groundwater management pursuant to other provisions of law or a court order, judgment, or decree, may, by ordinance, or by resolution if the local agency is not authorized to act by ordinance, adopt and implement a groundwater management plan pursuant to this part within all or a portion of its service area.”

The City of Cerritos is supplied by Central Basin Municipal Water District and City groundwater wells. This project will extend the City of Cerritos’ Recycled Water System to Forest Lawn Cemetery in the City of Cypress and convert the existing Forest Lawn Cemetery irrigation system from potable water to recycled water. Therefore, this project does not directly affect groundwater levels or quantity.


