

H. Groundwater Management Plan Compliance

Project Sponsor	Project Number and Title	Groundwater Compliance Applicability and Justification
CCWD	1 – East Contra Costa County Lawn to Garden Rebate Program	Project 1 would not involve groundwater, but may indirectly benefit groundwater levels or quality by reducing demands from potable water providers (i.e. City of Brentwood, City of Oakley) who use groundwater to supplement supply.
City of Brentwood	2 – Brentwood Non-Potable Water Distribution System Phase III	The City of Brentwood is a groundwater user and has met GWMP requirements. Self-certification form stating compliance with GWMP requirements is included with this application. The installation of this non-potable water line will reduce the amount of groundwater that is used by the City of Brentwood. This will help preserve existing groundwater levels.
Delta Diablo	3 – Delta Diablo Recycled Water Supply Expansion and Residential Fill Station Project	Project 3 would not involve groundwater, but may indirectly affect groundwater usage by the City of Pittsburg who uses groundwater to supply their water supply.

City of Brentwood	John Samuelson (925) 516-5307, jsamuelson@brentwoodca.gov	The City of Brentwood overlies about 14.8 square miles of the Tracy Subbasin of the San Joaquin Valley Groundwater Basin, designated by DWR as Subbasin No. 2-9.03. The Tracy Subbasin underlying the City is classified as very low priority basin by CASGEM. The City and Delta Diablo Water District developed a Groundwater Management Plan in 2011 to plan and manage groundwater resources of the Tracy Subbasin. The GWMP was submitted to, and approved by, DWR in 2011. The City's GWMP self-certification is provided on the following page.


