## Attachment 7 – Disadvantaged Community Assistance

A disadvantaged community is defined in the Proposition 84 IRWM Guidelines (2015) as a community with an average median household income (MHI) of 80% or less of the state's average, as calculated based on the US Census American Community Survey 5-Year Data: 2009-2013 (with an MHI of \$61,094 and hence a calculated DAC threshold of \$48,875).

The entire Upper Pit IRWM planning area may be considered disadvantaged as shown by DWR's mapping tools, below:


Upper Pit Region showing with IRWM and DAC Tracts layers on:
