

Attachment 7. Gold Village Drought Resiliency

DAC status: In 2015, a Median Household Income (MHI) survey conducted by the Rural Community Assistance Corporation determined River Highlands/Gold Village as a DAC, with an MHI of no higher than \$41,796. (Please see Attachment 7-A which includes *River Highlands Community Services District Median Household Income Final Report*.) State approval for the study methodology is also provided in Attachment 7-A, DWR's DAC Determination for Gold Village. The project is entirely within a DAC, and 100% of the benefits from this project accrue to a DAC.

Need: This project concerns the critical water supply needs of the 84-household River Highland/Gold Village DAC. Emergency restrictions were initiated in September 2010 because the water in the community's single storage tank ran dangerously low and, in July 2013, the water tank was emptied by demand exceeding storage capacity. Current storage cannot meet peak daily summer demand of 51,115 gallons. Absolutely no water surplus exists in case of an emergency, such as extremely hot weather, a pump malfunction, damage to a hydrant, or a residential or wild fire.

The community currently faces acute disruptions to its water service for additional reasons: The Community Service District (CSD) relies on one primary and two backup wells within the same fractured bedrock aquifer. (The original water supply consisted of eight wells, of which five were abandoned because of low production or contamination.) In a 2.5-month period (April-June 2014), depth to groundwater dropped 182 feet in one of the primary source wells (which provides 81% of supply) due to overdrafting and drought. This prompted an emergency declaration on July 8, 2014, still in effect, that prohibits all outdoor use of potable water. Average use as of June 1, 2015, was 134 gpd per household. Depth to groundwater is holding steady at 120 feet below surface in the primary well (pump is at 400 feet) as of June 2015, the onset of summer.

Further, the CSD's water supply operations costs have not been covered by service rates. The CSD has partially addressed this by completing the Proposition 218 process to convert to a tiered, metered water rate. Since electricity costs from water pumping are the water system's second-largest annual budget expense at \$19,000, the district could become more economically sustainable by reducing these costs 17% by engaging residents in water savings under the proposed conservation rebate programs.

How project addresses need: This project will address the DAC's need through the following: Adding a new tank that will provide 250,000 gallons of additional storage capacity to improve supply reliability, especially at peak summer demand; improving system sustainability by conserving 11.7 acre-feet per year through fixture and appliance and turf replacement rebate programs; addressing critical supply and drought resiliency by seeking a potential new water source, either within a different aquifer, or surface water from Nevada Irrigation District or other purveyor; and improving public understanding and participation in conservation via two rebate programs. Energy savings from reduced pumping due to water conservation are projected to be 26,616 kWh per year (17%), resulting in reduced operating costs to the CSD of \$5,338 per year.

Further, the IRWMP's vulnerability assessment identified reduced water supply reliability, declining snowpack (and thus diminished groundwater recharge), increased occurrence of drought, and increased groundwater extraction in reaction to climate change as regional vulnerabilities. The project addresses those vulnerabilities and offsets the costs of conservation for those who might not otherwise be able to afford them, achieves water conservation and greater energy efficiency, and contributes to the CSD's economic sustainability.

This project will help the CSD sustainably provide its customers with safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water for drinking, bathing, sanitation, and cooking to meet basic human needs, thus addressing the Human Right to Water Policy. Without the project, the CSD will unlikely be able meet the policy because provision of domestic water is currently uncertain given the lack of adequate storage to meet peak demand, heavy reliance on a single well where levels have dropped precipitously, and where low well and tank levels have resulted in water use restrictions.





The State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Financial Assistance requested that Rural Community Assistance Corporation (RCAC) perform an income survey of River Highlands Community Services District (CSD) located in Yuba County. The purpose of this survey is to establish a median household income (MHI) level for state and federal funding programs and sources. This survey has been completed and the results are attached.

The MHI for River Highlands CSD is \$41,796 with a response rate of 84 percent.

River Highlands CSD has 84 parcels; seven (7) are vacant homes, and one (1) vacation home, leaving 76 parcels (households) to survey. The number of households in a range between 71 - 77 requires a sample size of 84 percent to meet State and Federal guidelines.

The 56 responses account for a 74 percent response rate. The State approved the default of eight (8) responses to bring the number of responses up to 64 for an 84 percent response rate.

Normally, an 84 percent response rate is encouraged for systems of this size. RCAC contacted State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Drinking Water and together they determined that even if the remaining eight (8) households (needed to obtain the 84% response rate) had responded with an income of \$97,692 (the highest income reported), the system would still have an MHI of no higher than \$41,796.

The survey was designed and conducted per Multi Agency Guidelines for Median Household Income Surveys established for the State Water Resources Control Board – Clean Water/Division of Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund (SRF), and United States Department of Agriculture – Rural Development.

Introduction: River Highlands Community Services District (CSD) is a publicly owned utility managed by a five member board elected by the public (California Public Water System Number (5800820). River Highlands CSD is located in Yuba County, approximately 20 miles east of Yuba, California.

There were a total of 84 parcels within the River Highlands CSD service area; seven (7) parcels are vacant homes, and one (1) vacation home, leaving 76 parcels to survey.

River Highlands CSD submitted a pre-application to obtain funding from State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Financial Assistance funding programs. The water system’s groundwater sources do not meet the peak daily demand in summer months. As a result, there have been water outages, and water conservation is routinely practiced. The proposed SRF planning project is to drill test wells at selected locations and conduct capacity evaluations. This will help to ensure the water system has a reliable source that meets safe drinking water standards.

In order to be eligible for optimal funding options, River Highlands CSD needed to establish their Median Household Income (MHI) for the service area. The Water Board requested that Rural Community Assistance Corporation (RCAC), a private, nonprofit organization, perform the MHI under RCAC’s California SRF contract with the State Water Resources Control Board - Division of Drinking Water.

**Survey
Rationale:**

The current census data encompassed a larger area than the proposed project boundaries (see Area Maps, Exhibit B, pages 13-20). Therefore, River Highlands CSD felt the census numbers did not adequately reflect the customers' household income. The addresses of those surveyed are attached and titled "Residents' List of River Highlands CSD" (see Exhibit C, pages 21-23).

**Income
Survey
Methodology:**

A unique survey number is randomly assigned to each household receiving a survey questionnaire to maintain the respondent's anonymity. The customer's personal information (name, phone, etc.) is considered confidential and is not provided to any funding agency or other entity. RCAC will retain the original survey forms containing personal information on file at their corporate office, 3120 Freeboard Drive, Suite 201, West Sacramento, California, 95691 for seven (7) years.

A letter of explanation was mailed and/or delivered on November 25, 2014 to all households within the survey area. The first survey letter and forms, and corresponding postage-paid reply envelope were mailed and/or delivered to each household on December 1, 2014. The second survey letter and forms, and corresponding postage-paid reply envelope were mailed and/or delivered to each household on December 15, 2014 that did not respond to the first survey (see Exhibit D, pages 24-34). The surveys were mailed back to RCAC to maintain customer privacy.

A door-to-door survey was performed on January 4, 2015 at the residences that had not responded to the two survey mailings. River Highlands CSD provided RCAC with addresses for the parcels used in the survey (see Exhibit C, pages 21-23). RCAC, in consultation with the State Water Resource Control Board – Division of Drinking Water, developed the survey letters and form (see Exhibit D, pages 24-34).

The income survey form listed income categories and requested respondents to provide the households total gross annual income from 2013 Federal tax filing. It also asked if the respondent had lived in the residence more than six months out of the year; if the residence was a vacation home, rental or commercial property; and how many people reside at the residence more than six months out of the year.

Funding agency guidelines require that an impartial agency conduct the income survey using an approved format. The median household incomes for the project service area survey was calculated by RCAC as follows:

The median income is defined as that income in the middle of the data collected from the universe after all incomes are ranked in order from lowest to highest incomes. For example, if there nine houses surveyed, and the five ranks of income are \$10k, \$13k, **\$14k**, \$19k, \$150k, then **\$14k** is the median income because it is two from the top rank and two from the bottom rank.

The median may require averaging if you have an even number of universe data available, and the two incomes in the middle are different.

Upon receiving the completed surveys, RCAC calculated the MHI for the project service area community. This number was submitted to the State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Financial Assistance (DFA) and State Revolving Fund administrators, and the water system owner/representatives.

The definition of household income is the total gross income in the previous calendar year, in this case calendar year 2013, from **all sources**, by all members of one single residence. The final results of the survey will be used by DFA to measure the community’s ability to finance the project and to determine whether or not assistance in the form of a special low interest loan rate or grant is needed.

Survey Results:

An income survey was conducted within the River Highlands CSD service boundaries. A summary of the results are listed below with more detailed information in the exhibits. The MHI for this survey only counted residences occupied for more than six months of the year.

There are a total of 84 parcels within the project area. Seven (7) parcels were vacant homes, and one (1) parcel a vacation home, leaving 76 parcels to survey. Of the 76 parcels, 56 responded to the survey. The 56 responses account for a **74 percent response rate**. The number of households in a range between 71 and 77 requires a sample size of 84 percent to meet State and Federal guidelines.

The State Water Board approved the default of eight (8) responses to bring the number of responses up to 64 for an 84 percent response rate.

Normally, an 84 percent response rate is encouraged for systems of this size. RCAC contacted State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Financial Assistance and together they determined that even if the remaining eight (8) households (needed to obtain the 84% response rate) had responded with an income of \$97,692 (the highest income reported), the system would still have an MHI of no higher than \$41,796.

The Median Household Income for River Highlands Community Services District is \$41,796 (see Exhibit E, pages 35-38).

The results of this survey may be used to support loans and or grant applications to multiple funding agencies, for multiple types of projects benefiting residents within the survey area. Each funding agency has unique criteria for determining funding awards. A funding agency may look at the survey in terms of whether a community is disadvantaged, the percentage of low to moderate income people in the survey area, the MHI of the survey area in relation to State non-metro MHI’s, or other criteria. These factors help a funder determine whether a project is eligible for funding, whether it is eligible for grants, what percentage of grant is available in a grant loan package, or what interest rates the project qualifies for in a loan. Eligibility of a project for funding changes with time, so the funding package available to a project this year might not be the same package available next year.

RCAC makes no claims regarding funding eligibility of any projects River Highlands (CSD) may be considering, now and in the future. Further, funding agencies generally use the most recent and accurate income survey results available when funding projects. RCAC makes no claims about how long the

results of this survey will remain valid before being superseded by other newer surveys. It is recommended that River Highlands CSD contact any funding agencies under consideration directly to discuss funding eligibility.

2. The DDW district engineer will be informed regarding the progress of the MHI survey. RCAC will send a monthly report to the DDW district engineer.

3. RCAC will make initial phone contact with the water system representative and the CRWA specialist in order to:
 - a. Ask if the water system has a chance of qualifying for disadvantaged status based on their knowledge of the constituents.

 - b. Encourage the water system to mail a community letter to the residents of the water system informing them of the proposed project and informing them about the importance of the MHI survey. Also encourage them to hold a community meeting to enable the residents to receive answers to their questions.

- c. Provide a preliminary timeframe for the MHI survey once RCAC has received all documents requested, and the community information is active in RCAC's database.

- d. Request the following information:

- 1) A water system service area street map that indicates:
 - a) The residence and commercial property parcels with physical addresses or assessor parcel numbers (APN) and street names within the water system service area.
 - b) The vacant lots and non-occupied houses, if known.
 - c) The houses that are used as vacation homes or vacation rentals, if known.
- 2) Need an address list of all primary residences and commercial properties. Use the comment column to note if the home is vacant, or a commercial business, or other condition (**see example below**). Please e-mail the completed list to RCAC contact person. Be sure to provide the following information in the spreadsheet:
 - a) APN, name, physical address, mailing address, city, state, zip and any comments for each residential parcel.
 1. Note for apartment complex's, mobile home parks, or duplex's we need the name of each tenant, physical address (includes unit number or letter), mailing address. You may need to obtain this information from the property owner or manager.
4. At approximately two week intervals after the community letter from the water system has been sent and the community meeting has occurred, RCAC will mail their own introductory letter and two survey response letters. RCAC will conduct a door-to-door survey of the residences that do not respond to the mailings in order to obtain the required response rate for the survey.

5. After the door-to-door survey has been completed, RCAC will compile the MHI survey report.
6. The full MHI report will be mailed and emailed to the SWRCB funding program and the RCAC contract manager. The two-page results report will be emailed to the water system representative and the DDW district engineer.







River Highlands Community Services District – Area Maps






River Highlands Community Services District – Street Map

The State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Financial Assistance requested that Rural Community Assistance Corporation (RCAC) perform an income survey of River Highlands Community Services District (CSD) located in Yuba County. The purpose of this survey is to establish a median household income (MHI) level for state and federal funding programs and sources. This survey has been completed and the results are attached (see Chart 1, page 2).

The MHI for River Highlands CSD is \$41,796 with a response rate of 84 percent.

River Highlands CSD has 84 parcels; seven (7) are vacant homes, and one (1) vacation home, leaving 76 parcels (households) to survey. The number of households in a range between 71 - 77 requires a sample size of 84 percent to meet State and Federal guidelines.

The 56 responses account for a 74 percent response rate. The state approved the default of eight (8) responses to bring the number of responses up to 64 for an 84 percent response rate.

Normally, an 84 percent response rate is encouraged for systems of this size. RCAC contacted State Water Boards – Division of Drinking Water and together they determined that even if the remaining eight (8) households (needed to obtain the 84% response rate) had responded with an income of \$97,692 (the highest income reported), the system would still have an MHI of no higher than \$41,796.

The survey was designed and conducted per Multi Agency Guidelines for Median Household Income Surveys established for the State Water Resources Control Board – Clean Water/Division of Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund (SRF), and United States Department of Agriculture – Rural Development.
