Dear Mr. Joseph:

The Piru Neighborhood Council (PNC) was formed on February 1, 1975. The PNC reviews and comments upon items impacting the community of Piru. Membership is extended to all residents of Piru, including the surrounding community area. Officers of the Council are elected by the membership. General planning issues affecting the Piru Sphere of Interest are referred to the PNC as it constitutes a public review forum.

Ventura County Waterworks District No. 16 (District) provides sewer service to the Piru community. The District recently completed construction of a new Piru Wastewater Treatment Plant (Plant). The District is now proposing to build a tertiary treatment facility (TTF) at the Plant to provide an additional and sustainable source of water for irrigation of agricultural land in the Piru area. The proposed TTF will also help avoid potential fines which may be imposed for non-compliance of the salts discharge requirements set by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board. To lessen the financial burden for residents of the disadvantaged Piru community who would have to bear the cost of constructing the TTF (or paying the potential fines), the District is applying for Proposition 84 (Prop. 84) grant funding for the proposed TTF project which has an estimated cost of \$3.75 million.

I am writing this letter of support as a private citizen. I live in the community and before I retired was the manager of a company that sold irrigation supplies. I will be serving as president of the PNC in 2011. I understand the TTF will eliminate discharge to percolation ponds from the Piru Wastewater Treatment Plant to comply with groundwater quality objectives, will provide a local drought-proof water supply that retains groundwater for M&I uses, and is necessary to help comply with salts discharge requirements. There are no other affordable options. Without assistance to help with the costs to construct the TTF, the project will be too costly for the disadvantaged community.

I, therefore, strongly recommend that this project be approved for Prop. 84 funding as part of the suite of projects presented in the Watershed Coalition County of Ventura IRWM Prop. 84 funding application.


