

Eligible Applicant Documentation

1. Public Agency – Assembly Bill 1329, Mello, which created the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District, was approved by the Governor on September 2, 1977. This authority is found in Chapter 527 of the California Statutes of 1977 (West’s Water Code – Appendix, Chapter 118). MPWMD was empowered for “collection, conservation, storage, reclamation, treatment, disposal, distribution, and delivery of water and sewage...”
2. Statutory authority – see above.
3. Under Section 304 (b) of the enabling legislation (see number 1), MPWMD may “Contract for, and perform contracts with public entities for performance of administration of the district, perform or contract for performance of tests, studies, and investigations as necessary and proper to carry out objects and purposes of the district.”
4. Legal agreements – There are no legal agreements between participating agencies at this time. MPWMD anticipates developing sub-contracts and a process to track expenditures and reimbursements.
