

Subject: University of California at Santa Barbara, Participation in Implementation of Watersheds Coalition of Ventura County (WCVC) Updated Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWMP)

The existing WCVC IRWMP was adopted in November of 2006 and represents the long-term efforts of numerous entities with vested interests in improving water quality, water supply reliability, water recycling, water conservation, flood control, recreation and access, wetlands enhancement and creation, and environmental and habitat protection in Ventura County. Since then, WCVC stakeholders have continuously collaborated on an ongoing IRWM program to meet the primary objectives of the WCVC.

The University of California at Santa Barbara is a project proponent within this Proposal, for a project that is consistent with the WCVC IRWMP. As such, the University of California demonstrates support for the WCVC IRWMP and will participate in active implementation of the WCVC IRWMP. In the past, the University of California Cooperative Extension has shown active participation in WCVC activities and has led collaboration throughout the watershed with Watershed U, a watershed-specific training program for better watershed management.

UCSB scientists have been participating in Plan implementation by assessing the status of ecosystem and wildlife elements in the riparian corridor, and participating in invasive plant removal and restoration activities. Various projects have also examined methods for reducing nutrient runoff from agriculture by installing bioswales and increasing the extent of native riparian forests as buffers. We are currently implementing a 10-acre arundo removal and habitat restoration project in the Santa Clara River in the Santa Paula area for the benefit of water resources and wildlife in the region.
