**ORDINANCE NO. 1-2006**

**OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE YOLO COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO ADOPT A GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN UNDER WATER CODE § 10750 THROUGH 10753.10 (AB 3030, STATS 1992, AND SB 1938, STATS 2002)**

The Board of Directors of the Yolo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District ordains as follows:

Section 1. This ordinance is adopted with reference to the following background recitals:

**WHEREAS**, the California Legislature has declared that groundwater is a valuable natural resource in California and should be managed to ensure both its safe production and quality; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent of the Legislature through the passage of AB 3030 (Stats 1992) and SB 1938 (Stats 2002), codified as Water Code sections 10750 through 10753.10, to encourage local agencies to work cooperatively to manage groundwater resources within their jurisdictions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Legislature also has declared that the additional study of groundwater resources is necessary to better understand effective groundwater management and to ensure the safe production, quality, and proper storage of groundwater in this state; and

**WHEREAS**, any local agency, whose service area includes a groundwater basin, or a portion of groundwater basin, that is not subject to groundwater management pursuant to other provisions of law or a court order, judgment, or decree, may by ordinance adopt and implement a groundwater management plan within its service area; and

**WHEREAS**, the Yolo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) is an independent, government organization created in 1951 by the Yolo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Act (Act); and

**WHEREAS**, the District was created to develop and promote the beneficial use of the water resources of Yolo County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Act and Water Code sections 10750 through 10753.10 authorize the District to adopt and implement a Groundwater Management Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, prior to adopting a resolution of intention to draft a groundwater management plan, the District held a public hearing in accordance with Water Code section 10753.2; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors approved a resolution of intent (Resolution No. 05.10) to draft a groundwater management plan on August 2, 2005; and

**WHEREAS**, interested members of the public were able to participate in the development of the draft plan, as described in the "Stakeholder Outreach" section of the plan (Water Code, § 10753.4, subd. (b).); and

**WHEREAS**, the District prepared a draft Groundwater Management Plan that was released for public review on April 14, 2006, made the draft plan available for inspection in the District's office, and the District published a notice concerning the availability to the public for review of the Draft Groundwater Management Plan as required under Water Code Section 10753.5; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 2, 2006, the Board of Directors held a public hearing to adopt the groundwater management plan pursuant to Water Code Section 10750 through 10753.10 for the purposes of receiving comments on and protests to adopting the plan and establishing a groundwater management program; and

**WHEREAS**, the District has not received a majority written protest against the plan under Water Code section 10753.6.

Section 2. The District hereby adopts the Yolo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Groundwater Management Plan in the form presented at this Board meeting.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its final passage.

Section 4. Within 15 days from the date of passage of this ordinance, the District Secretary shall: (a) publish it at least once in a newspaper of general circulation published and circulated in the Agency; and (b) submit a copy of the plan in electronic format to the State Department of Water Resources.

The foregoing ordinance was introduced by the Board of Directors at its meeting on May 2, 2006, and duly passed and adopted by the Board of Directors of the District at its meeting on June 6, 2006 by the following roll call vote:



**ORDINANCE NO. 1527**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WOODLAND, CALIFORNIA  
ADOPTING A GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN**

**WHEREAS**, California law requires local agencies wishing to be eligible for certain types of state funding for water-related improvements to adopt groundwater management plans; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of California encourages local agencies to develop integrated regional solutions for water management and to coordinate the management of surface and groundwater to work together toward improving regional water supply reliability and quality; and

**WHEREAS**, adoption of a groundwater management plan will provide a framework for coordinating groundwater management activities among stakeholders, and will identify the basin management goals and objectives needed to guide efforts to effectively manage the groundwater basin as a safe and sustainable water supply;

**NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1.** The City Council adopts the recitals set forth above as its findings in connection with the adoption of this ordinance.

**SECTION 2.** The City Council hereby adopts the 2011 Groundwater Management Plan prepared for the City by West Yost Associates.

**SECTION 3.** The City Council has reviewed and considered the information in and regarding the 2011 Groundwater Management Plan and hereby determines that the implementation of the plan and adoption of this ordinance are exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to Title 14, sections 15262, 15306, 15307, and 15308 of the California Code of Regulations, which exempt from CEQA feasibility and planning studies; information collection; activities taken to maintain, restore, or enhance a natural resource; and activities to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement, or protection of the environment. The City Council further finds that the 2011 Groundwater Management Plan meets the requirements of these exemptions because it includes consideration of environmental factors, including the impacts of global climate change, and includes no construction activities or relaxation or environmental standards. Implementation of the 2011 Groundwater Management Plan and adoption of this ordinance are also categorically exempt pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) because they will cause no serious or major disturbance of any environmental resource. The City Clerk shall file a Notice of Exemption with the County of Yolo.

**SECTION 4.** This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption and, within fifteen (15) days after its passage, shall be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation published and circulated within the City of Woodland.






