### **Fall, Winter Dates Set For Water History Exhibits**

SACRAMENTO --- Exhibits depicting California's water development will be shown at various locations during the fall and winter as part of California's 150th celebration of statehood.

The Department of Water Resources created the photo-montage exhibits to describe water history from Indian and Spanish mission years up to today's high tech water systems.

Funded by the 29 water agencies that purchase State Water Project water, under long-term contracts, the exhibits will be on display through 2000.
