Water History Exhibit Schedule

SACRAMENTO---Azusa, Cucamonga, Oroville and Santa Barbara are among venues selected over the next three months for displays showing California's water development during the past 150 years.

Sesquicentennial exhibits depicting major events in California water history will be displayed in more than a dozen communities during March, April and May. They trace water history from Indian and Mission days to today's advanced water systems.

Since touring began in 1998, the photo-montage exhibits have been displayed at more than 20 locations.
