SACRAMENTO – The Reclamation Board of California has scheduled a tour of flood control projects at Lake Success and Lake Kaweah near Farmersville on October 18 and a meeting of the Reclamation Board in Visalia on October 19.

The tour will encompass briefings on the operations of Terminus Dam, Lake Kaweah Flood Control Project and the Tule River, Success Lake Enlargement Projects.

The meeting of The Reclamation Board in Visalia is open to public comments and will include a report of activities of the Department of Water Resources and proposed approval of an oil and gas lease in Sutter County with Petrogulf Corporation. Other agenda items include reports on climate change, San Joaquin River management, and CALFED ecosystem restoration.
