DWR To Hold Public Workshop in Woodland  
on Emergency Levee Repairs

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of Water Resources (DWR) will conduct a public workshop on Wednesday evening in Woodland, Yolo County, to outline emergency repairs scheduled this summer for levee sites in the region.

It is the first in a series of public workshops scheduled through July to keep communities informed on upcoming emergency construction activities. The public workshops are part of an Executive Order signed by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger earlier this year directing the Department to repair a total of 29 critical erosion sites along the Sacramento River Flood Control System.

The Woodland meeting will begin at 6 p.m. Wednesday, June 7 2006, at the Woodland Public Library, Leake Room, 250 First Street in Woodland. Representatives from DWR and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will be on hand to discuss planned construction activities at three levee erosion sites on Cache Creek and four sites along the Central Sacramento River, all in Yolo County.
