DWR Announces Step One Results of 2007 Proposition 50
Water Use Efficiency Grant Program
Workshops Scheduled

SACRAMENTO – The Department of Water Resources (DWR) has released the Review & Evaluation results of Step 1 Concept Proposals for the 2007 Water Use Efficiency Program Proposal Solicitation Package (PSP).

Of the 216 Concept Proposals (Step 1) DWR received in response to the PSP, 106 were selected and are invited to submit Full (Step 2) Proposals.

Invitation to submit a full proposal is not a guarantee of funding. The Invitations are based solely on the ranked averages of proposals or up to 200 percent available funds within each category of funding, whichever comes first. This provides another round of competition complete with review and evaluation. Successful proposals will be selected for funding.
