DWR Announces Proposal Solicitation Package
for the Local Groundwater Assistance Grant Program:
Four Workshops Scheduled

SACRAMENTO -- The Department of Water Resources has released its Proposal Solicitation Package (PSP) and scheduled application workshops on the Local Groundwater Assistance Grant Program (AB 303).

Grants are available to conduct groundwater studies, monitoring, or groundwater management activities.

A total of \$6.4 million is available and the maximum grant amount is \$250,000 per applicant. Applications are due December 11, 2007. More information on the Program, PSP, and the workshops is posted on the following website:
