

ORDINANCE NO. 1414

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA HABRA
AMENDING LA HABRA MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 15.20.040
REGARDING WATER CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS

The City Council of the City of La Habra does ordain as follows:

Section 15.20.040 of the La Habra Municipal Code is hereby amended
and shall read as follows:

SECTION 1.

"15.20.040 Water closet flush quantity.

Tank-type water closets installed in all new construction
including single-family dwellings, multiple dwellings,
condominiums, townhouses, motels, hotels, commercial, industrial
and public buildings shall be of a design that uses not more than
1.6 gallons of water per flush."

SECTION 2.

Should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be
invalid or unconstitutional, all other provisions of this
Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect as approved.


SECTION 3.

The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the
passage of this Ordinance. The City Clerk shall cause the same to
be published or posted in the manner prescribed by law. This
Ordinance shall become effective after 30 days from its adoption.



AUTHORIZING APPROVAL OF THE URBAN
MANAGEMENT PLANNING OF 2000. THIS ACT IS
KNOWN AS AB 797.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Approve Resolution No. ___ that authorizes the City of La Habra to forward this report prepared in accordance with the Urban Water Management Planning Act(ACT) of 1983 (or Assembly Bill(AB) 797, as it was referred to while pending before the California State Legislature) to the Department of Water Resources (DWR).

DISCUSSION:

Since the City of La Habra Urban Water Management Plan of 1995 plan was approved, the Urban Water Management Planning Act has been amended. Amendments include the deletion of the requirements to present water and sewer rates; however, this plan will generally discuss water rates under the Water Demand Management Programs. Amendments also contain the requirement to include discussion on supply reliability, recycled water, expanded water demand detail addressing 14 BMPs as Signatory to the Memorandum of Understanding, and inclusion of the DWR checklist as an optional approach to completing the plan.

Historical water demand in Orange County is strongly related to land use and population. In general, as population increased, water demand increased. From 1970 to 1995, Orange County population increased 82% and water demand increased 55%. From 1995 to 2000, population increased an additional 10% resulting in an overall growth from 1970 to 2000 of 101%. Water demand use increased 13% between 1995 and 2000 for an overall growth from 1970 of 79%.

The overall slower growth in water demand is due mainly to a change in land use from agriculture to urban/suburban and successful water use efficiency (conservation) efforts. Water

demand decreased 14% from 1990 to 1992 when the public was urged to conserve due to a statewide drought and the region was in an economic recession. From 1997 to 1998, water demand decreased 9% due to El Nino climatic conditions; more than double the average rainfall.

FISCAL IMPACT:

RECOMMENDATION:

City Council approves Resolution No. _____ authorizing City of La Habra to forward the Urban Water Management Plan to Department of Water Resources by the end of this year.
