Costs of waste disposal

The City and other local agencies are required by state law to inform citizens about the actual cost to collect and dispose of residential solid waste when the charge to residents is less than 90% of the actual cost. The City of Santa Clara subsidizes the cost of solid waste disposal; more

than 10% of the costs are paid from the General Fund Operating Budget. The report below lists the actual costs (on average) per household for the second quarter of 2005. Questions about this information may be addressed to the Street Department at 615-2063.

Long-range water plan gets revisions

The City of Santa Clara Urban Water Management Plan is now being revised to reflect current estimates of the amount of water that will be necessary to meet the water needs of residents and businesses for the next 20 years. All water utilities in the state are required to prepare similar plans every five years.

The detailed plan covers such topics as projected water use; projected water supplies, and descriptions of the actions that the City would take in the event of a drought or catastrophic loss of water supply. In addition to helping to manage water resources, the plan is used to analyze new development projects proposals.

City staff is working with representatives from neighboring cities and the two water wholesalers, the Santa Clara Valley Water District and the San Francisco Water Department, to prepare the first draft of the 2005 Urban Water Management Plan. The draft will be available for public review in Santa Clara public libraries later this year. Comments on the draft can be made to the City Water Utility or at a public hearing at a regular City Council meeting in November of this year.

Some water customers to receive fluoridated water

In September, the San Francisco Water Department will begin fluoridating the water the City purchases from the Hetch-Hetchy water system. This change in the water supply will affect customers north of Highway 101 as well as a small area bordered by San Tomas Expressway, Central Expressway, Calabazas Creek and Highway 101 [see map]. Customers in these areas receive water from the Hetch-Hetchy system or a blend of water from Hetch-Hetchy and groundwater.

Here are a few common questions and answers about water fluoridation.

What is fluoridation?

Fluoridating drinking water adjusts the concentration of fluoride to a level that protects teeth and improves dental health. The optimal level of fluoride
