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
## FOREWORD

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



Figure 1. CENTRAL BASIN



## I. THE CENTRAL BASIN

The Central Basin is a large ground water basin underlying the southeastern part of the Los Angeles Coastal Plain. It is bounded on the north by the hills between the Central Plain and the San Gabriel Valley, on the east by Orange County, on the south and west by the Newport-Inglewood Uplift (Figure 1).

Most of the 227-square-mile Basin is urban-suburban and contains 23 incorporated cities. A substantial portion of the water needed by them is pumped directly from the Basin.

About twenty years ago an overdraft of the ground water resulted in declining water levels, triggering sea-water intrusion and threatening the ground water supply. But timely legal action halted it and prevented serious damage to the Basin. Today, ground water use in the Central Basin is restricted by a Superior Court Judgment and monitored by a court-appointed Watermaster, whose prime duty is to administer the controls prescribed by the Judgment and report annually to the Court and parties on significant ground-water-related events that occur in the Basin. The Basin has been under the Watermaster for thirteen years.

### History of Water Resources Development

One hundred years ago, the Los Angeles Coastal Plain was on the threshold of a boom. The key to its future was water.

But a shortage of sufficient year-round surface water in the Central Basin forced the early development of ground water sources. As early as 1870, water users had tapped the artesian wells and springs east of the Newport-Inglewood Uplift. When those wells stopped flowing, users were forced to drill shallow wells which supplied enough water to continue economic growth.

Ground water development spurted dramatically in 1909 with the advent of the deep-well turbine pump. Its tremendous adaptability and superior operating characteristics placed efficient water wells within economic reach of everyone. In time, reliable water supplies attracted industry and agriculture. Eventually, however, the demand for ground water exceeded the natural replenishment of the Central Basin.

The resulting overdraft was signaled by dropping ground water levels and a few small areas of sea-water intrusion. The rapidly increasing cost of pumping and an occasional well failure because of dropping water levels were the chief economic causes of the Central Basin's serious ground water problem.

The deteriorating ground water situation in that Basin and the adjoining West Coast Basin led to the formation of the Central Basin Water Association in 1950. This led to a plan to:

1. Provide a supplemental water supply to major producers;
2. Limit ground water extractions from the Central Basin;
3. Create an exchange water pool to provide ground water pumping rights for water users lacking access to other supplemental water supplies.

Step 1 was realized in 1952 when the Central Basin Municipal Water District was formed to distribute water from the Colorado River. The District was annexed to The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD) in 1954, and Colorado River water soon flowed into the Central Basin.

The West Basin and the Central Basin Water Associations were largely responsible for the creation of the Central and West Basin Water Replenishment District (CWBWRD) in 1959. This special District covers 420 square miles of the Central and West Coast Basins (Coastal Plain) of Los Angeles County. Its objective is to replenish and maintain the ground water basins by purchasing imported water, recharging the Basin, and halting sea-water intrusion. The District financed this program during the 1974-75 water year by placing a tax of \$14 during the first nine months and \$21 during the last three months on each acre-foot of ground water extracted in the District.

On January 2, 1962, the Central and West Basin Water Replenishment District filed Case No. 786,656 in the Superior Court, County of Los Angeles, naming more than 700 parties as defendants. It sought to obtain quiet title to the right to the use of ground water and regulate withdrawals from the Central Basin to protect the water supply from deterioration.

Adverse ground water conditions and the indefinite period before final adjudication prompted the Central Basin Water Association to draft an interim agreement curtailing extractions from the Basin. By September 1962, the proposed agreement had been approved by a sufficient number of water producers (producers owning over 75 percent of the Assumed Relative Rights within the Basin) to guarantee control over ground water pumping in the Basin. On September 28, 1962, the Court signed the "Order Pursuant to Stipulation and Interim Agreement and Petition for Order" and appointed the Department of Water Resources (DWR) Watermaster.

To avoid the protracted litigation experienced by other Watermaster Services Areas in Los Angeles County, the attorneys representing principal parties held monthly meetings to work

out a settlement. A stipulated judgment was drafted. Approval by public utility water companies and other producers represented well over 200,000 acre-feet (75 percent) of the total rights within the Basin. This was a prerequisite to filing the stipulated judgment with the Court.

A pretrial was held in March 1965 and on May 17, 1965, the case went to trial before the Judge Edmund M. Moor. After a week's testimony on engineering, geology, hydrology, safe yield of the Basin, and arguments on water right entitlements, the case was continued to August 25, 1965. Shortly thereafter, Judge Moor appointed DWR Watermaster. The final Judgment was signed on October 11, 1965, and became effective on October 1, 1966.

### Watermaster Service

Watermaster Service is administered by DWR in accordance with Part 4, Division 2, of the California Water Code, Watermaster Service Areas are created by DWR, either at the request of water users or by order of the Superior Court. The first Watermaster Service Area was formed in September 1929. Currently, there are 20 such Areas controlling the surface water diversions in Northern California and four in Southern California controlling ground water extractions.

Once a month every ground water pumper reports his extractions to the Watermaster. This makes possible updating of his water right account (Watermaster Production Summary) by computing the amount pumped during the previous month, the amount pumped during the current water year, and the amount that can legally be pumped during the remainder of the year. A copy of the Watermaster Water Production Summary is mailed to the pumper each month.

If electric-meter readings are reported along with water-meter readings, electric-power consumption can be correlated with water production. Erratic or rapidly increasing electric-power consumption vs. water production, for instance, may suggest an inefficient pump, system losses, or an inaccurate water meter. In this manner, the Summary occasionally indicates malfunction of pumps or water meters.

The Watermaster's field staff calibrates the water meter on every active water well at least once every two years. Accurate measurement of ground water extractions is absolutely necessary to the success of the Basin's management plan. All available means, including system efficiency tests, are used to confirm water-meter test results. One copy of each test is furnished to the well owner and inaccurate meters must be repaired within 30 days. Follow-up tests on repaired meters and initial tests on new wells are scheduled whenever necessary. Parties may also request a meter test at any time.

During the 1974-75 water year, the Watermaster evaluated historical ground water production records of several parties. All the reviews were routine and resulted in minor uncontested changes in the record.

#### Central and West Basin Water Replenishment District (CWBWRD)

CWBWRD is an active water conservation organization in Los Angeles County. It is responsible for replenishing the underground water supply of both the Central and West Coast Basins.

The creation of water replenishment districts is a statutory procedure established by the Legislature. Division 18 of the California Water Code describes the duties and obligations of such a district, which has powers well suited to solving ground water problems, whether they be quality- or quantity-oriented.

CWBWRD is comprised of a Board of Directors and a small staff. It is actively engaged in several replenishment programs. These programs, i.e., water spreading, barrier operation, and in-lieu replenishment, are described in this report. CWBWRD also publishes an annual report of its operations. (Additional information can be obtained from its staff, 7439 East Florence Avenue, Downey, CA 90240, 213-773-5790.)

The Watermaster cooperates closely with CWBWRD because: (1) Watermaster Service Areas in the Central and West Coast Basins closely coincide with the District boundaries; (2) both CWBWRD and the Watermaster are required to record all ground water extractions from the Basins; (3) CWBWRD was the plaintiff in the Central Basin Water Rights Case, (Case No. 786,656, Superior Court, Los Angeles County); (4) both CWBWRD and the Watermaster are concerned with the usefulness of the ground water basins in the Coastal Plain.

Many of the Watermaster's data-collection programs are coordinated with the CWBWRD to prevent duplication. Hence, monthly or quarterly water-well reports are sent to the Watermaster through CWBWRD.

#### Summary of 1974-75 Operating Conditions

Rain was almost normal (94 percent) and was 3 percent less than the year before. There has only been one wet year (1972-73) in the past six years. The subnormal concentrated rainfall in 1974-75 decreased by 1 percent the amount of local runoff that was conserved by spreading. Overall conservation efforts, excluding barrier operations, dropped by 6 percent.

Extractions of ground water increased by 1 percent after dropping to an all-time low in 1972-73. Extractions were less (4,300 acre-feet) than the total Allowed Pumping Allocation, as experienced in nine of the last 13 years. Imports were down by 13 percent and have been fairly stable in the last six years. Exports were down 2 percent.

Water levels at key wells have risen in the north portion of the Central Basin, have stabilized in the central portion and have slightly dropped in the south.

Table 1 compares statistics for this period of record and the prior water year.

Exchange Pool water requests decreased by 76 percent to 545 acre-feet. The price was \$45.76, based on the new price structure approved by the Court. There were 94 leases totaling 11,197 acre-feet and 22 sales totaling 2,353 acre-feet. Water right sales have reduced the number of parties from 508 (1966-67) to the current 282.

Twenty-nine parties overextracted a total of 1,180 acre-feet. Eight parties exceeded permissible limits; all eight have taken steps to eliminate their overextractions. The Watermaster recommends no action by the Court.

During the 1974-75 water year, the Watermaster received Water Right Transfer documents involving the Bellflower Home Garden Water Company, John A. Erickson, and Donald R. Plunkett. These documents cause uncertainty regarding the legal ownership of 22 acre-feet of Allowed Pumping Allocation in the Central Basin. Details are described in Chapter IV, page 57.

## II. WATER SUPPLY CONDITIONS

Water from many sources is required to serve the needs of Southern California's thriving urban economy. Water from the Colorado and Owens Rivers, northern California, runoff from mountains, ground water, and reclaimed waste water contribute to one of the largest water supply systems in the world. Northern California water became available to the area during 1973-74.

### Precipitation




Figure 2. PRECIPITATION STATIONS

Southern California enjoys a Mediterranean-type climate characterized by hot, dry summers and sparse precipitation during the winter. The average rainfall on the Central Basin during 1974-75 was 13.05 inches. This is 94 percent of the estimated 90 years' normal rainfall on the Coastal Plain. The mean seasonal precipitation on the Basin (base period 1897-1947) varies from 12 inches at Long Beach to 16 inches at Whittier Narrows. The locations of the precipitation stations used to measure rainfall, and the annual amount recorded are shown on Figure 2.

Local precipitation in the Basin does not influence the ground water supply of the Central Basin to any great degree. A layer of impermeable material lies between the surface and the producing aquifers, except in the forebay areas. As a consequence very little of the annual rainfall reaches the zones whence it can be pumped back to the surface. Below normal rainfall (about 84 percent of normal) in the nearby San Gabriel Mountains reduced the runoff, which is captured at the Whittier Narrows.

#### Ground-water Recharge

Natural replenishment of the Basin's ground-water supply is limited to inflow through Whittier Narrows (and some underflow) from the San Gabriel Valley. Some of the water that percolates into the forebay areas of the Central Basin eventually crosses the Central-West Coast Basin barrier and into the West Coast Basin. For several years, outflow and extractions have exceeded natural replenishment, thus upsetting the Basin's balance.

Today, attempts are being made to reestablish nature's balance. One method of artificial replenishment is water spreading. Water is flooded on areas where it can percolate into the underground aquifers and supplement the natural recharge supply. Large quantities can be returned to the ground by spreading, but the process is limited by the space available for spreading facilities and the ability of the recharge aquifers to transmit water back to the Basin.

The reduced quantities of runoff during 1974-75 resulted in a corresponding reduction in the amount of local runoff conserved. Storm runoff conserved was 99 percent of the storm runoff conserved the year before, while the purchased water spread was 92 percent of amount purchased and spread last year. Reclaimed water from two nearby plants amounted to 18 percent of the total spread. The total amount of supplemental water purchased was 3.1 times the local runoff.




FIGURE 3 SPREADING GROUNDS AND BARRIER PROJECT

The Los Angeles County Flood Control District (LACFCD) operates spreading grounds along the Rio Hondo and San Gabriel Rivers in the Montebello forebay of the Central Basin (See Figure 3). The entire spreading operation is summarized in Table 2.

#### Alamitos Barrier Project

The Alamitos Barrier Project, designed to prevent sea-water intrusion into the fresh aquifers of the Central Basin, is of great importance to water users in the Central Basin.

Sea-water intrusion at the mouth of the San Gabriel River (Alamitos Gap) poses a serious threat to the ground water supply. This area has seven water-bearing zones identified in downward order as the Recent aquifer, C-Zone, B-Zone, I-Zone, Main (Silverado) aquifer and Lower Zone (Sunnyside) aquifer.

Sea-water intrusion occurs through the Recent Zone, which is very permeable and open to the sea. The C, B, A, and I Zones merge with the Recent Zone and are therefore susceptible to intrusion, which is noteworthy for the varying degrees of salinity occurring in water found in each zone. The saline water intrusion was detected as far as 10,000 feet landward of the Newport-Inglewood fault zone and, if unchecked, could extend into the Silverado and Sunnyside aquifers, which are the principal ground-water-producing zones in the Basin.

LACFCD successfully operates a combination saline water extraction trough and freshwater pressure ridge to halt intrusion. In addition to the extraction wells and injection wells required, a number of observation wells are also part of the project. These provide geological data along the barrier and are used to monitor ground water levels and water quality in this area. The information from this monitoring program will be utilized in determining if additional barrier facilities are necessary. Since operations of the barrier began in 1965, the sea-water intrusion problem has been effectively contained. The location of the barrier is shown on Figure 3, page 15.

Water injected in 1974-75 was 29 percent less than in 1973-74. Seventeen injection wells of the total 18 were in operation in 1974-75. The quantity of water extracted was the lowest in the last ten years of operation. Table 3 shows the scope of the project.

## Water Quality

The battle for good quality water in the Central Basin began many years ago. In fact, it was essentially a water-quality problem that prompted the Central Basin litigation. Many of the aquifers underlying the Los Angeles Coastal Plain are separated from each other by impervious material. However, some of the aquifers are hydraulically connected to the ocean, so occasionally one or more adjacent aquifers may become impaired by sea water. If a well is drilled downward through two aquifers, one clean, one polluted, without using proper casing techniques, water can move from the polluted aquifer to the unpolluted one.

To prevent such occurrences, DWR conducted an intensive investigation that resulted in recommended standards for water-well construction and destruction.<sup>1/</sup> Hearings on adopting these standards were held in 1969 by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, and it now reports that all local agencies and municipalities in the Central Basin have adopted them.

One of the most important pieces of legislation enacted by the 1969 Legislature was the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act (Water Code, Division 7, commencing with Section 13000), effective January 1, 1970. This Act made extensive revisions in California's water-quality control laws and is one of the most stringent in the nation.

The Regional Boards can now enforce discharge requirements without showing the existence of conditions of pollution or nuisance. If a discharger violates requirements of the Boards and no action is taken to correct deficiencies in discharge, the Board may request enforcement by the Attorney General. Violations of a Regional Board cease-and-desist order could result in a maximum fine of \$6,000 for each day of violation.

Solid-waste disposal has become a major problem in Southern California during the past 25 years. Daily, the average Californian generates five pounds of solid waste that must be disposed of somewhere. Suitable dumpsites are becoming more difficult to find -- particularly in urban areas. In recent years, tremendous pressure has grown to use abandoned gravel pits as dumpsites.

CWBWRD, Central Basin Water Association, and various other agencies have vigorously opposed all applications for permission to operate sanitary landfill programs in the Central

Basin. Opposition to the use of gravel pits as dumpsites will undoubtedly continue until fool-proof sealing methods are developed to prevent pollution of ground water by leachates.

### Basinwide Water-quality Monitoring

In compliance with the Beilenson Health Act, the Central Basin Water Association initiated a basinwide plan to monitor the quality of water being pumped for domestic use. The requirements of the Act apply to each domestic water purveyor having 200 service connections or more. The plan as developed by the Association is a joint plan, which was accepted and approved by the State Department of Health on November 9, 1973.

Title 17 of the Administrative Code, more particularly Part 1, Chapter 5, Subchapter 1, defines the limits of the trace elements and pollutants acceptable for domestic water use. To properly monitor trace elements and pollutants, 44 purveyors have agreed to participate in the testing by the Clinical Laboratories of San Bernardino. The City of Los Angeles and California Water Service Company have elected to perform their own testing; however, they will cooperate by furnishing their test results to the Association for inclusion in the report to the Department of Health. With acceptance of the Association's plan, five purveyors, who, because of the number of service connections are subject to the Act, have not indicated their desire to participate in the testing. The Association implemented the program in 1973-74.

On October 31, 1975, the Central Basin Water Association submitted its second annual report to the Department of Health "Annual Summary Report on Results of Basinwide Groundwater Quality Monitoring in the Central Basin". It summarizes the results of the monitoring conducted according to the program outlined above.

The average Chloride, Sulfate, Hardness and TDS concentrations in the Central Basin ground water wells tested during 1975, compared with the annual averages compiled for 1974-75 fiscal year for imported Colorado River water and water from the State Water Project, are as follows:

The Watermaster is arranging with the Association's staff to establish areawide carbon-chloroform extract (CCE) tests at selected key wells. These tests will be performed when the

Watermaster's field staff routinely calibrates the water meter on these wells. Results of the CCE tests will be incorporated in the Annual Summary report described above.

### In-lieu Replenishment

During the 1965-66 water year, CWBWRD began a program of in-lieu replenishment. The program is authorized by Section 60230 of the California Water Code. In effect, CWBWRD was given the power to contract with any producer having access to supplemental water instead of pumping water from the ground.

California Water Service Company, in the West Coast Basin, has been thus far the only participant. The results of the program are summarized in Table 4.

The program may be used to: alter pumping patterns within a ground water basin; replenish areas of low transmissibility where conventional recharge techniques are ineffective; heighten the effect of injecting water to form a sea-water barrier by reducing extractions in the vicinity; reduce the amount of replenishment water purchased by CWBWRD; and reduce the annual ground water extraction from a ground water basin.

### Construction Projects Affecting Water Supply

Three major projects have significantly affected the water supply of the Central Basin: the State Water Project, MWD's distribution system, and the second barrel of the Owens River-Mono Basin Aqueduct of the City of Los Angeles.

All have been completed within the past five years and are providing beneficial service to the Basin. MWD's Middle Cross Feeder began deliveries on December 1, 1972, and is the main source of Northern California water for the Basin. Water from the State Water Project constituted approximately 52 percent of the total imported during 1974-75.

One other project of considerable interest to Central Basin water users is the County Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County's plan to reclaim waste water. Considerable benefits from spreading reclaimed water in the forebay areas of the Central Basin may eventually materialize. Reclaimed waste water from the Whittier Treatment Plant is spread in the recharge basin. On or about November 15, 1972, the San Jose Treatment Plant began to supply reclaimed waste water for spreading in the Montebello forebay area.

The County Sanitation Districts are currently investigating alternative plans for future operations - to the year 2000. The plan will have an impact on water quality vs. energy consumption, recycling vs. wasting, public health vs. recreation, etc., and will have to be balanced between them. Alternatives will cost about \$55 - \$60 million a year, to the year 2000.

#### Ground-water Levels

Every water-well owner in the Central Basin is concerned with ground-water levels because the cost of pumping water is largely dependent on the distance it must be lifted.







Figure 4 FLUCTUATION OF WATER LEVEL ELEVATIONS

Figure 4 shows water level information in the form of selected hydrographs.

Location of these key wells is shown below. The hydrographs are representative of the several aquifers underlying the Basin. In general, they show that the water surface has stabilized and, in some cases, risen slightly because of recharge operations and changing extraction patterns.

Additional water level information is contained in CWBWRD's annual report.

### III. WATER USE

During the 1974-75 water year, purveyors in the Central Basin served more than 344,000 acre-feet to their customers. The Basin contained 1,243 wells -- 704 active, 319 inactive, 18 injection, and 202 observation. 3 were drilled and 39 were destroyed (Appendix C). The water service areas of the parties in the Basin are shown on Plates 1, 2, and 3, pages 28-33.

A rapid population increase in the Central Basin has caused water demand to increase substantially each year. Prior to 1961, ground water from the Basin satisfied most of the demand. However, the Judgment reduced extractions to 217,367 acre-feet annually, so imported water has rapidly become an important component of the area's water supply.

Figure 5 illustrates the ground water extractions and imported water use from 1952 to the present, less San Gabriel Valley imports. Much of the imported demand during the mid-sixties may be attributed to the curtailment of ground water extractions. The early seventies saw a leveling in this demand.

Figure 6 provides another graphic analysis of the monthly relationship between rainfall, ground-water extractions, and imported supplies. Note how rainfall conditions affect the demand.

#### Ground-water Extractions

The Central Basin Judgment limits the amount of ground water each party can extract annually from the Basin (October 1 through September 30 of each year). This limit is referred to as the "Allowed Pumping Allocation" (APA). Recipients of exchange pool water may pump the amount released to them in addition to their APA. Table 5, pages 24 through 27, is a balance sheet summarizing each party's "water account".

The metered ground-water production from each active well in the Basin is listed by party in Appendix B, Tables B-1 and B-2. Table B-1 lists parties that report on a monthly basis; Table B-2 lists parties that report on a quarterly basis. Normally, water wells producing more than 25 acre-feet per year must be equipped with a water meter and be reported monthly. Wells producing less than 25 acre-feet per year do not necessarily require a meter and may be reported on a quarterly basis. Wells where ground water was extracted are shown on Plates 4 and 5, pages 36-38.

A numbering system designated as a State Well Number is assigned to all wells for identification. This system is explained in Figure 7, page 35.





To provide flexibility in the control of ground-water extractions, the Judgment contains provisions allowing the parties to carry over into the succeeding water year a portion of their unused water right and in some cases to overextract. This flexibility was necessary to meet unforeseen emergencies in water demand.

One provision allows parties to carry over from one water year to another any unused APA not to exceed 10 percent of their APA, or 10 acre-feet, whichever is greater. In addition, any unused exchange pool water can be carried over into the following water year. Chapter 4 contains additional information on this provision.

Parties are also allowed to overextract by 10 percent of their APA, or 2 acre-feet, whichever is larger. Under certain circumstances, parties may overextract in greater amounts. However, prior approval of the Watermaster must be obtained and, in any case, must be made up the following water year.

#### Extractions by Nonparties

To keep the parties and the Court apprised of all ground-water extractions within the Central Basin, the Watermaster collected information on nonparty ground-water extractions shown in Table 6. The nonparties were not named in the Central Basin Judgment and as such are not under the jurisdiction of the Watermaster.


#### Water Well Identification


State Well Numbers identifying each water well in the Central Basin are derived from a system based on the U. S. Public Land Survey. Each number consists of township and range designation, a section number, a letter representing the 40-acre tract in which the well is situated, a sequence number indicating the chronological order in which the well number was assigned, and a letter representing the base and meridian. The last letter is frequently omitted from well numbers in a single area because all wells there share a single base and meridian. The components of well No. 3S/11W-12C03S, for example, are identified in Figure 7.

Well numbers are assigned and recorded by the Watermaster. In addition, information on each well shown on Plates 4 and 5, is maintained in the Watermaster's office. A full inventory and field inspection of all wells will be conducted in 1975-76 to update these records.









## Land-Use Study, 1973

A land-use inventory of Coastal Los Angeles County, including the Central Basin was conducted by DWR and was reported in the District Report "Coastal Los Angeles County Land-Use Study, 1973". The study, based on January and February 1973 aerial photography, was conducted from August 1973 to September 1974.

Water use is intimately associated with land use. Results from this study are extremely valuable to water planners. Detailed land use tabulations and the District Report are available for inspection in the Southern District office. Shown below are the 1973 land-use characteristics for the Central Basin as surveyed and depicted in the above mentioned report.

## Imports and Exports

Large quantities of water are imported to the Central Basin from other sources. Water from the Colorado River and State Water Project arrives through MWD's facilities for distribution throughout the Basin by the Cities of Long Beach, Los Angeles, Compton, the West Basin Municipal Water District (WBMWD), and the Central Basin Municipal Water District (CBMWD). The City of Los Angeles also imports water from the Owens River-Mono Basin in east Central California. In addition, the City of Inglewood imports ground water from the West Coast Basin. California Domestic Water Company, San Gabriel Valley Water Company, Suburban Water Company, and the City of Whittier import ground water from the San Gabriel Basin.

Exports from the Central Basin are very small as compared to imports. The City of Long Beach exports blended ground water, Northern California water and Colorado River water to the West Coast Basin, while the California-American Water Company and the City of Signal Hill export ground water to the West Coast Basin. Imports and exports are listed in Table 7.



#### IV. ADMINISTRATION OF THE JUDGMENT

The Central Basin Judgment was a logical step toward preserving the usefulness of a valuable natural resource. It provides a flexible tool to limit extractions and still allow beneficial use of the ground-water supply. However, restriction on extractions imposed by the Judgment forces the parties to look for other supplies. Fortunately, these are available. If they were not, the rapidly increasing demand for water might literally bankrupt the Basin before other basin management techniques could be developed.

##### Exchange Pool

The Court and parties foresaw that adjudicating the water rights in the Central Basin and limiting the total extraction would not suffice all parties. For this reason, Part III, Subpart C of the Judgment authorizes an Exchange Pool to provide additional water rights for parties without a supplementary supply. Tables 8 and 9 summarize the 1974-75 Exchange Pool transactions.

Membership in the Exchange Pool is voluntary, and any party may join by filing with the Watermaster and the Court a "Notice of Intention to be Bound by the Exchange Pool". This notice is also contained in the Exchange Pool Offer or Request form. There are nine nonsignatory parties to the Exchange Pool.

On or about September 30 of each year, the Watermaster mails an Exchange Pool form to each party, requesting that the form be completed and returned to the Watermaster by November 10. The form provides for making: mandatory offers of water rights to the pool, referred to as "Required Subscription" in the Judgment; "Voluntary Subscription"; and requests for water rights from the pool. In completing the form, the member must estimate his water needs and supply for the ensuing water year.

A Required Subscription must be made to the pool when a member has a connection to supplementary water and can obtain imported water from MWD or the Central and West Basin Municipal Water Districts. The Required Subscription is limited to 20 percent of the member's APA, except that the Required Subscription, plus the party's water needs for the year, cannot exceed the party's total supply.

A Voluntary Subscription may be made by any member of the Exchange Pool. The only requirement: The member's supply must exceed his estimated needs and only the difference may be offered.

However, the Watermaster must first allocate all the Required Subscriptions before using the Voluntary Subscriptions in filling Category (a) Requests.

A Category (a) Request is defined as that quantity requested by a member not in excess of 150 percent of his APA, or 100 acre-feet, whichever is greater. Category (b) Requests are those which exceed the 150 percent, or 100 acre-feet, limitation. Whenever there are insufficient Required Subscriptions to meet all Category (a) Requests, Voluntary Subscriptions may be used in lieu of Required Subscriptions. Category (b) Requests are filled exclusively by Voluntary Subscriptions.

Experience has shown that there have always been sufficient Required Subscriptions to meet all the Category (a) Requests; as a result, no Voluntary Subscriptions have been used to fill

Category (a) Requests. It is doubtful whether Voluntary Subscriptions will ever be used to meet Category (a) Requests. Consequently, very few Voluntary Subscriptions are used in the Central Basin Exchange Pool. The only instances where Voluntary Subscriptions are used are in cases where requests exceed the 150 percent, or 100 acre-foot, limitation.

During the 1974-75 water year, there were no members to the Exchange Pool whose requests met these criteria.

A Request for Exchange Pool water rights may be made when a member's estimated needs exceed his total supply, including leases.

The price charged for Exchange Pool water rights is fixed by Part III, Subpart C, Paragraph 10 of the Judgment. This provision was amended by Court order on September 28, 1973, and became effective in 1973-74. A copy of the amendment was reproduced in Appendix D of the 1972-73 annual report.

The price is now based primarily on: (a) the type of imported MWD water used by the Exchangers during the preceding fiscal year (July 1 - June 30); (b) the cost of such water, predicated on the average price to be charged by CBMWD during the water year for each type of water; (c) plus \$2 fixed fee; (d) less \$8, which is the estimated average incremental cost of pumping water in the Basin; and (e) less the current replenishment assessment, \$14 in 1974-75. Since item (a) varies among Exchangers and Items (b) and (c) vary from year to year, the cost of Exchange Pool water will likewise vary among Exchangers and from year to year. The Exchangor's Exchange Pool price is averaged to determine the Basinwide price. The 1974-75 price, referred to as the Basinwide Average Exchange Pool Price, was \$45.76.

Payments for Exchange Pool water rights are made in four equal monthly payments. The first payment is due the Watermaster on or before December 31 and the remaining three payments on or before the last day of the next three succeeding months. After sufficient payment has been received, the Watermaster disburses quarterly amounts to the parties whose offers were sold.

#### Exchange Pool Carryover

The Central Basin Exchange Pool provides additional pumping rights to parties at a relatively high price. The authors of the Judgment therefore believed that the parties should be allowed to pump their entire exchange-water-right purchases, regardless of the provisions limiting carryover of water rights. Therefore, a specific exchange water carryover provision was drafted and included in the Judgment.

The provision specifically allows a party who purchased exchange water to carry over the unpumped portion of his allowable extraction until all of the exchange water is pumped. Table 10 lists each party who carried exchange water into the

1974-75 water year, the amount of water carried forward, and the additional costs. The charge is authorized by the Judgment and is based on the difference in the prices of exchange pool water between the year the water was purchased and the succeeding year. No carryover charge was made this year, since the cost for Exchange Pool water for 1974-75 was less than that for 1973-74. Table 5 page 24, also shows those parties having a carryover of exchange water from the 1974-75 to the 1975-76 water year.

#### Transfers of Allowed Pumping Allocations

The Central Basin Exchange Pool is not the only method of obtaining additional pumping rights. Each water year, there are a number of water-right-lease-and-sale transactions between parties. Table 11 lists leases, sales, parties, and amounts involved.

Appendix A also records all sales of water rights between parties and shows the current ownership of Allowed Pumping Allocations by each of the parties as of September 30, 1975.

Suggested samples of water-right-lease-and-sale agreements are illustrated in Figure 8, page 55. The Watermaster recommends that all documents be prepared on an 8-1/2 x 11-inch sheet of paper. Any necessary additions to the recommended agreement may be attached to another page. You need not use these sample documents, but they are sufficient for most purposes.

The "General Information, Policies and Procedures" of the Watermaster Service in the Central Basin reads as follows:

*"In order that a water right lease be in force (applicable) during a particular water year, it must have been executed by the parties involved before or prior to September 1 of the water year in question. In addition the executed water right lease document must be filed with the Watermaster no later than August 31 or postmarked August 31 of the year in question. Any otherwise valid agreement not filed with the Watermaster prior to September 1 of the water year in question will be void and of no force or effect for the transfer of water rights."*

When property, on which water rights have been developed is sold, the Watermaster must be furnished a copy of the sale document. The sale document is required for the proper accounting of the water rights. The Watermaster assumes that the water rights pass on to the new owner unless specifically reserved in the sale document.

In leasing, buying, or selling water rights, parties should be specific as to the type being exchanged, i.e., Total Water Right or Allowed Pumping Allocation. All leases should be entered into on the basis of Allowed Pumping Allocation, whereas sales should specify both amount of Total Water Right and amount of Allowed Pumping Allocation, each to the nearest whole

The Watermaster keeps a list of parties who have informed him of their interest in buying, selling or leasing Water Rights. Any party wishing to be listed should call the Watermaster. This is not done as a Court required function of Watermaster Service. It is an informal courtesy established to assist parties unable to resolve problems regarding an excess or deficiency of Water Rights. The Watermaster will make no recommendation regarding transactions conducted relative to the use of this service. The names of all parties using this service are available in the Watermaster's office and may be obtained by telephone or visit to the office.

### Overextractions

Each year some parties extract more ground water from the Central Basin than they are entitled to. The overextractions are usually small, within the tolerance set by the Judgment. Each party may overextract by 2 acre-feet, or 10 percent, of his Allowed Pumping Allocation, whichever is greater, on the premise that the overextraction will be eliminated during the following water year. Any overextractions above this limit must have prior approval by the Watermaster. Most overextractions are caused by unexpected increases in water demand, so it would be unreasonable not to allow some deviation from the limits and guidelines of the Judgment. Table 12 summarizes all overextractions during the 1974-75 water year.

Of the 29 parties listed, 21 did not violate the provisions in the Judgment pertaining to overextractions; 8 overextracted in violation of the Judgment; however, all have taken steps to eliminate their overextractions.

The Watermaster recommends that no action be brought against those parties who overextracted, as they have all taken steps to eliminate their overextractions.

**Findings and Determinations by Watermaster**

WITH RESPECT TO EACH PARTY LISTED ON TABLE 12 CONTAINED IN THIS PORTION OF THE REPORT ON "OVEREXTRACTIONS", THE AMOUNT SHOWN IN COLUMN 6 CONSTITUTES THE QUANTITY OF WATER IN ACRE-FEET BY WHICH THAT PARTY HAS OVEREXTRACTED GROUND WATER FROM THE CENTRAL BASIN IN EXCESS OF THE QUANTITIES PERMITTED TO IT UNDER AND PURSUANT TO THE JUDGMENT IN THE CENTRAL AND WEST BASIN WATER REPLENISHMENT DISTRICT, PLAINTIFF, VS. CHARLES ADAMS, ET AL. DEFENDANT, CASE NO. 786,656, LOS ANGELES SUPERIOR COURT. EACH SUCH PARTY'S ALLOWED PUMPING ALLOCATION FOR THE WATER YEAR 1975-76 AS SHOWN IN APPENDIX A OF THIS REPORT, IS REDUCED BY SAID QUANTITIES SHOWN IN COLUMN 6, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PART III, SUBPART B, PARAGRAPH 3 OF THE JUDGMENT, EXCEPT INsofar AS THAT PARTY HAS ORDERED AND HAS BEEN ALLOCATED EXCHANGE POOL WATER FOR THE WATER YEAR 1975-76. THE FOREGOING STATEMENTS CONTAINED IN THIS PARAGRAPH CONSTITUTE A DETERMINATION AND FINDING BY THE WATERMASTER PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PART II OF SAID JUDGMENT.

From time to time the Watermaster evaluates historic ground water production records of parties at the request of the parties or at the Watermaster's discretion. In some instances, the evaluations and findings result in minor uncontested changes in the records to the benefit of the party or vice versa.

The administration of the Judgment was hampered to a degree by the failure of a number of parties in submitting their production reports to CWBWRD by the prescribed date. The "General Information, Policies and Procedures" bulletin, published by the Watermaster and mailed to all the parties, sets the deadline for submitting the reports as the 15th of the month for the water pumped during the preceding month.

The Judgment makes provision under Part II, Subpart 3, Appeal from Watermaster Decisions Other Than With Respect to Budget for reversal of any Watermaster decision. It provides essentially that:

- (1) Any party may object to any Watermaster decision by making written objection thereto within 30 days after the Watermaster mails written notice of his decision.
- (2) Within 30 days after delivery of the written objection, the Watermaster shall consider the objection and amend or affirm his decision and give notice to all parties.
- (3) Any party may file with the Court within 30 days of the Watermaster's notice any objection to any affirmation of decision and bring the same for hearing before the Court at such time as the Court may direct, after first serving objection upon all other parties. The Court may affirm, modify, amend or overrule any decision of the Watermaster.

During the 1974-75 water year, the Watermaster received Water Right transfer documents executed between:

- (1) Donald R. Plunkett, grantor, and John A. Erickson, grantee, for 22 acre-feet of A.P.A.
- (2) Donald R. Plunkett, grantor, and Bellflower Home Garden Water Company, grantee, for 20 acre-feet of A.P.A.

These documents both purport to transfer identical water rights in the Central Basin. The Watermaster decided that although the transfer document with Bellflower Home Garden Water Company was received by the Watermaster before the Erickson document, the date on the Erickson document was earlier than that on the Bellflower Home Garden Company document and therefore the transfer to John A. Erickson should prevail.

The Watermaster mailed notice of his decision to the concerned parties. The Watermaster received written objection to his decision from Mr. Plunkett within the required 30 days period. A final legal ruling on this problem was not made by the end of the 1974-75 water year.

### Carryover of Allowed Pumping Allocation

The provision in the Judgment (Subpart A, Part III) relative to allowable carryover of unused water rights states in part: "Each party ... who ... does not extract ... a total quantity equal to such party's Allowed Pumping Allocation for the particular water year ... is permitted to carry over from such water year the right to extract from the Central Basin in the next succeeding water year so much of said total quantity as it did not extract ..., not to exceed 10% of such party's Allowed Pumping Allocation, or 10 acre-feet, whichever ... is the larger". (Emphasis added.)

The Coast Packing Company made a written request to the Watermaster that they be allowed to carryover into the 1975-76 water year an amount greater than their allowable 10 percent due to operational difficulties. The Watermaster decided that an unreasonable hardship would be imposed upon the party without the additional carryover, so permission was granted.

The method of computing the allowable carryover and allowable overextractions was changed, effective with the 1972-73 water year. It is now assumed that when not specifically passed to the lessee by the lease document, the amount leased is not deducted from the lessor's Allowed Pumping Allocation for computing the allowable carryover or overextraction. All future lease documents must contain a statement as to which party receives the benefit of the amount leased for computing carryover or overextractions. Item (5) in Figure 8, suggested in Water Right License and Agreement (page 55) is sufficient for this requirement.

## V. ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS

The Central Basin Area was established as a Watermaster Service Area in accordance with Part 4, Division 2, of the Water Code of the State of California. Therefore, as provided under Section 4201, the cost of administering the Service Area and the distribution of water therein is payable one-half by the State and one-half by the parties.

### Cost of Watermaster Service for 1974-75

The Judgment requires that the Watermaster prepare and mail a copy of the tentative budget to each of the parties at least 60 days before the beginning of each water year. If no objections are received within 15 days after submitting the budget, it becomes final.

The tentative budget submitted to the parties on July 31, 1974, is presented in Table 13. There were no objections and it was adopted as the final budget on August 15, 1974.

The administrative cost chargeable to the parties was apportioned among the parties as directed by the Judgment. The Judgment provides that if the portion of the final budget payable by the parties is equal to, or less than \$5 per party, the cost shall be equally apportioned among the parties. However, if the parties' share of the budget is greater than \$5 per party, each party will be assessed a minimum of \$5 and the total amount so collected will be deducted from the parties' share of the budget. The balance to be collected is then assessed among the parties in proportion to their Allowed Pumping Allocation in excess of 65 acre-feet.

Apportionments of parties' share of the budget for the water year 1974-75 are set forth in Table 14. A 5 percent penalty is assessed if payments become delinquent. In this respect, 17 parties were penalized as their payments were not made within the allowable 30 days after service of the statement of the amount due. Assessments totaling \$100.85 were collected for delayed payments.

Income and expenditures for Watermaster service during the 1974-75 water year are shown in Table 15. Any credit or debit balance is carried forward into the succeeding water year.

Chapter IV presents information on Exchange Pool water carry-over. This provision directs the Watermaster to bill and collect from those parties having a carryover of Exchange Pool water the difference in price per acre-foot for Exchange Pool water when the price in the succeeding water year exceeds the price of the previous year. Since the Exchange Pool price did not increase between water year 1973-74 and 1974-75, no money was collected for Exchange Pool water carried forward. See Table 10 (page 49) for a detailed breakdown. These additional payments, when collected, are considered miscellaneous income to the Watermaster and are applied towards that share of the Watermaster's budget to be paid by the parties.

In addition to the above-mentioned receipts, \$32.15 was collected for delayed payments in the operation of the Exchange Pool. The penalties were assessed in accordance with Exchange Pool procedures and the additional miscellaneous income thus collected was applied towards the parties' share of the budget.
