WHEREAS, a special election was called and ordered to be held on Tuesday, the 20th day of January, 1948, pursuant to the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California entitled, "An act to provide for the organization, incorporation, and government of Municipal Corporations," approved March 13, 1883, as amended to date, within the territory hereinafter described, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors therein the proposition of determining whether or not said territory should be incorporated as a municipal corporation of the sixth class under the name and style of the City of ORANGE COVE; and

WHEREAS, it appears that notice of said election was duly and legally given, that voting precincts were properly established, that election officers were appointed and election supplies furnished, and that in all respects said election was held and conducted and the votes cast thereat received and canvassed, and the returns thereof made and declared in the time, form and manner required by said Act and the general election laws of the state governing such elections; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of said County of Fresno met on Monday, the 26th day of January, 1948, said date being the Monday next succeeding such election, to canvass the votes cast thereat, as required by law, as a result of which the said board finds that the number of votes cast, the results of said election, and other matters required by law, to be as hereinafter stated, now therefore

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the territory proposed to be incorporated, as aforesaid, is situate in the County of Fresno, State of California, and is particularly bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Section 13 in Township 15 South, Range 24 East, M. D. B. & M.; thence south along the west boundary of said section to the southwest corner thereof; thence east along the south boundary of said Section 13, to the southeast corner thereof; thence north along the east boundary of said Section 13, to the Northeast corner thereof; thence north along the east boundary of Section 12, Township 15 South, Range 24 East, M. D. B. & M., to the Northeast corner of the South half of the South half of the Southeast quarter ( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section 12, Township 15 South, Range 24 East, M. D. B. & M.; thence west to the Northwest corner of the South half of the South half of the Southeast quarter ( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section 12, Township 15 South, Range 24 East, M. D. B. & M.; thence south to the North quarter section corner of said Section 13; thence west along the North boundary of said Section 13, Township 15 South, Range 24 East, M. D. B. & M., to the point of beginning;

Also described as Section 13, Township 15 South, Range 24 East, M. D. B. & M., and the South half of the South half of the Southeast quarter ( $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $S\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section 12, Township 15 South, Range 24 East, M. D. B. & M.

2. That said special election was held and conducted in the said territory on Tuesday, the 20th day of January, 1948, in time, form, and manner as required by law.

3. That there was one election precinct established and provided for the holding of said special election, the boundaries of which were the boundaries of the said territory as above set forth.

4. That the whole number of votes cast on the question of incorporation in the territory so proposed to be incorporated as aforesaid, was 336, of which number of votes cast therein, 182 were in favor of the incorporation and 154 were against incorporation.

5. That the total number of votes cast in said territory on the election of officers for said proposed incorporation was 1719 . That the names of the persons voted for, the offices for which they were voted, the number of votes given in said precinct to each of the said persons, together with the whole number of votes which they received in the entire territory, were as follows:

RESOLVED FURTHER, that as a result of said special election, it appears to said board that the majority of the votes cast in said territory on the question of incorporation were in favor of said incorporation, wherefore said board hereby declares the said territory as above described to be duly incorporated as a municipal corporation of the sixth class under the name and style of the City of Orange Cove.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that at said special election Gabriel Coigny, Robert B. Cole, A. A. Pauley, Calvin C. Sechrist, and Arthur H. Vogel,

having received the five highest number of votes for the offices of councilman of said city, are hereby declared to be duly elected to the offices of councilman of said city; also that Edgar R. Lindsay, having received the highest number of votes cast for the office of City Clerk, is hereby declared elected to that office; also that Burt J. Duwe, having received the highest number of votes cast for the office of City Treasurer, is hereby declared to be duly elected to that office.

RESOVED FURTHER, that the County Clerk be, and he is hereby, directed to cause this Resolution and Order to be entered in full upon the minutes of said Board and to cause a copy thereof, duly certified, to be filed in the office of the Secretary of State.

The foregoing Resolution and Order was duly adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Fresno County, California, this 26th day of January, 1948, by the following vote, to wit:
