Ecology Action is pleased to present for DWR consideration the WaterLink: Save Water, Save Energy Program. The project and Ecology Action are contract-ready per the requirements of the grant solicitation and the contract specifications provided.

Authorizing Documentation

Eligibility Documentation/ Eligibility Narrative

Ecology Action is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit in the State of California. We are legally authorized to enter into a grant agreement with the State of California. Once we have a signed contract agreement with DWR, Ecology Action would proceed to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Santa Clara Valley Water District that reiterates partner roles and responsibilities as defined in the District's Letter of Support (see Attachment 3), and would also proceed to contract with the California Conservation Corps to complete Project 3 as outlined in the Scope of Work (Attachment 3) and Budget (Attachment 4). Project agreements with specific property owners will be executed before project implementation. Project agreements will be specific to a scope of work for a specific facility/residence (as outlined in Attachment 3) and will specify that projects must be completed before any grant incentive funds are distributed.

Urban Water Management Compliance

Ecology Action is not an urban water supplier and therefore not required to complete AB1420 Compliance and Metering Compliance Forms. Ecology Action is collaborating with the Santa Clara Valley Water District who has provided statewide leadership amongst urban water suppliers and is a longstanding member of the Urban Water Conservation Council.

Ground Water Management Compliance (CASGEM)

The water wholesaler in our program service area is Santa Clara Valley Water District (SCVWD). SCVWD is compliant with California Statewide Groundwater Elevation Monitoring (CASGEM). The District's Groundwater Monitoring and Analysis Unit actively monitors the Santa Clara Subbasin (DWR Subbasin 2-9.02) and Llagas Subbasin (DWR Subbasin 3.301) and tracks seasonal and long-term trends in groundwater elevations.

Agricultural Water Compliance

No agricultural water suppliers will receive funding from the proposed grant.

Surface Water Diversion Compliance

No surface water diverters will receive funding from this grant.
