
DAC Benefits

IRWD will be focusing program efforts on the DAC identified within its service territory – Census Tract 6059075515. IRWD staff have already preliminarily screened residential customers located within this DAC and have identified approximately 422 dwelling units which may be good candidates for the program. The DAC along with the rest of the participating customers within the District service area will benefit from the program through potentially reduced bills as a result of device water and energy savings. In addition, water savings achieved through this program will help decrease the District's reliance on imported water supplies, resulting in greater supply reliability for its customers.

Since roughly 400 of the over 3000 anticipated program participants are expected to be customers within the identified DAC, about 10-15% of the project benefit will be provided to the DAC. While this benefit is less than the 75% cutoff determined by DWR, IRWD is committed to supporting underserved areas within its service territory, as is evidenced by past participation in low-income direct install programs.



A map is included on the following page that shows the location of the project, benefit area, and DAC census tracts.
