Proposal Monitoring Plan

For the Jensen Service Area High Efficiency Toilet Rebate Program, monitoring and assessing the programs progress will be accomplished using well-established procedures in Metropolitan's historically-successful conservation program. Metropolitan will record the number of rebate applications received and the number of rebates issued to the member agencies. Based on the number of rebates issued, reductions in water use will be determined. Reporting frequency will be finalized through the agreement development process.

For the Jensen Solar Power Project, the schedule, budget and expenses will be tracked with Metropolitan's existing project controls system. Invoices from the solar power system provider will be received, reviewed and paid through Metropolitan's existing account payable system. Energy generated from the solar power facility will be monitored continuously and recorded. Based on the solar power generated, the energy savings and greenhouse gas (GHG) reductions will be calculated and reported. Reporting frequency will be finalized through the agreement development process.

A detailed monitoring program will be finalized once the grant has been awarded.
