2. Eligible Applicant Documentation

Eligible applicants are local agencies, joint powers authorities, or nonprofit organizations. The applicant must provide a written statement (and additional information if needed) containing the appropriate information, as follows:

- a. *Is the applicant a **local agency**, joint powers authorities, or nonprofit organization, as defined in Appendix B? Please explain.*

Padre Dam Municipal Water District (District) is a **local agency** as defined in Appendix B of the 2014 Water-Energy Grant Guidelines.

The District is a public agency, a Special District of the State of California, which provides water, wastewater, recycled water and recreation services to residents in East San Diego County including Santee, El Cajon, Lakeside, Flinn Springs, Harbison Canyon, Blossom Valley, Alpine, Dehesa, and Crest. The District serves 100,000 residents with over 24,000 active service connections to the potable water system.

The District provides water, recycled water, sewer, and recreational services. Water service is provided to the City of Santee, portions of El Cajon, and the eastern unincorporated areas of Lakeside, Flinn Springs, Harbison Canyon, Blossom Valley, Alpine, Dehesa, and Crest. Sewer service is provided to the City of Santee, portions of El Cajon, and unincorporated area of the County of San Diego.

- b. *What is the statutory or other legal authority under which the applicant was formed and is authorized to operate?*

The District is a special district governed, pursuant to the Municipal Water District Law of 1911 (California Water Code, Section 71000 et seq.) as a result of an election held on December 2, 1952.

The District is a public agency governed by a five-member Board of Directors, each representing a geographic area within the District.

- c. *Does the applicant have legal authority to enter into a grant agreement with the State of California?*

If successful, the District has the legal authority to enter into a grant agreement with the State of California. The Board of Directors will consider adopting the resolution contained in Attachment 1.1 which will authorize the General Manager to execute the agreement.

- d. *Describe any legal agreements among partner agencies and/or organizations that ensure performance of the project and tracking of funds.*

As part of the project implementation, the District will enter into a Cooperative Agreement with Republic Services' San Diego Landfill Systems Sycamore Landfill in order to implement the project.
