Definition:

***Project Benefit(s)*** refers to measurable benefit(s) in addition to water and energy savings and GHG emission reductions that result from project implementation. Examples of additional project benefits include, but are not limited to, improved water quality, increased water supply reliability, reduction in utility cost; or increasing employment in or job training in a Disadvantaged Community (DAC).

Comments:

How is *improved water quality* measured and from what baseline and/or monitoring point?

How is *increased water supply reliability* measured and from what baseline and/or averaging point?

How is *reduction in utility cost* measured?

How is *increasing employment in or job training in a Disadvantaged Community (DAC)* measured? In what census tract location is the basis for employment and/or training?

Definition:

A ***Project*** is a collection of planned activities performed in a sequence to construct a physical facility or implement a non-structural solution that reduces both water and energy use and GHG emissions.
