California Water Plan sets plenary session for Sept. 18 and 19

The California Water Plan is hosting its second plenary session on Sept. 18 and 19 in Sacramento. The two-day meeting will preview Volume 1 of Update 2009, show the differences from Update 2005, and review the Update 2009 strategic plan elements. The latest drafts of the Resource Management Strategies (Volume 2) and Regional Reports (Volume 3) will be presented. There will also be presentations on modeling and scenarios; environmental justice and disadvantaged communities; recycled water; and integration with regional planning and flood management. Workshop planned on governor's statewide water conservation plan

A panel of urban water conservation officials will ask the public what it thinks about targets for water conservation statewide by 2020 at a workshop Sept. 15 in Sacramento. In February, Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger called on state and federal agencies to come up with a plan to cut per capita urban water use 20 percent by 2020; the group is called the 20x2020 Agency Team. Water Plan's climate change panel will meet tomorrow

The Climate Change Technical Advisory Group will meet tomorrow, Aug. 28, in Sacramento to discuss draft sections of the Water Plan Update 2009, including how climate change science will be addressed in the update.
