Volume 3 includes Regional Reports about the 10 hydrologic regions, the mountain counties

area, the Delta, and a comprehensive look at the entire state. Each report includes a discussion of the region, key challenges; ongoing programs; and information on water supplies and how they're used. ### State climatologist takes a look at climate change science

DWR has released a draft of State Climatologist Michael Anderson's report regarding the state of climate change science for water resource operations, planning, and management. ### SWAN plans workshop to review, discuss future scenarios

The Department of Water Resources will hold a workshop of the Statewide Water Analysis Network (SWAN) on Feb. 11 in Sacramento. DWR staff will present narrative scenarios and initial model results for Water Plan Update 2009. The objective of this workshop is to review preliminary Water Evaluation and Planning (WEAP) model results and consider ways to present the future scenarios and associated water demands and supplies in Update 2009.
